





Gate Current vs. Gate-Source Voltage




**Gate Current vs. Gate-Source Voltage** 










On-Resistance vs. Junction Temperature




On-Resistance vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage



Single Pulse Power (Junction-to-Ambient)




Source-Drain Diode Forward Voltage





Normalized Thermal Transient Impedance, Junction-to-Ambient (On 1" x 1" FR4 Board with Maximum Copper)




Normalized Thermal Transient Impedance, Junction-to-Ambient (On 1" x 1" FR4 Board with Minimum Copper)


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


