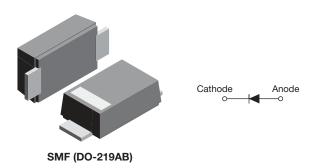
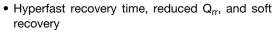

The planar structure and the platinum doped life time control guarantee the best overall performance, ruggedness and reliability characteristics.

These devices are intended for use in snubber, boost, lighting, piezo-injection, as high frequency rectifiers and freewheeling diodes.

The extremely optimized stored charge and low recovery current minimize the switching losses and reduce power dissipation in the switching element.

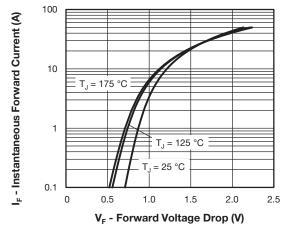

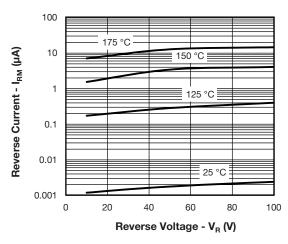


Fig. 2 - Typical Values of Reverse Current vs. Reverse Voltage

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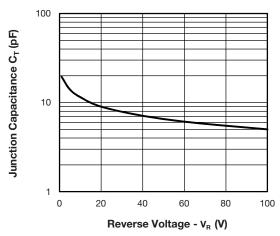


Fig. 3 - Typical Junction Capacitance vs. Reverse Voltage

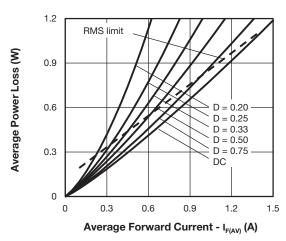


Fig. 5 - Forward Power Loss Characteristics

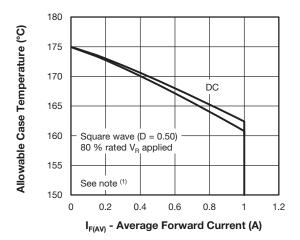


Fig. 4 - Maximum Allowable Case Temperature vs. Average Forward Current

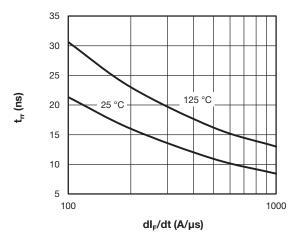


Fig. 6 - Typical Reverse Recovery Time vs. dl<sub>F</sub>/dt

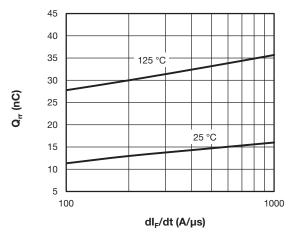
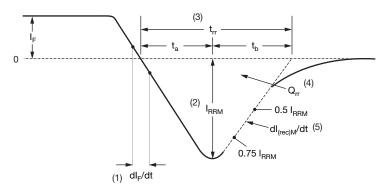


Fig. 7 - Typical Stored Charge vs. dl<sub>F</sub>/dt

(1) Formula used:  $T_C = T_J - (Pd + Pd_{REV}) \times R_{thJC}$ ;  $Pd = Forward Power Loss = I_{F(AV)} \times V_{FM}$  at  $(I_{F(AV)}/D)$  (see Fig. 6);  $Pd_{REV} = Inverse Power Loss = V_{R1} \times I_R (1 - D)$ ;  $I_R$  at  $V_{R1} = rated V_R$

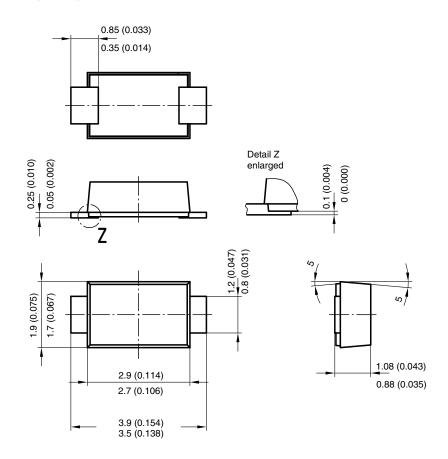
Fig. 8 - Reverse Recovery Waveform and Definitions

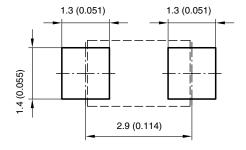
