






Figure 1. Typical Output Characteristics




Figure 2. Typical Output Characteristics




Figure 3. Typical Saturation Voltage Characteristics




Figure 4. Typical Transfer Characteristics




Figure 5. Saturation Voltage vs. Case Temperature at Variant Current Level




Figure 6. Capacitance Characteristics




Figure 7. Gate Charge Characteristics




Figure 8. SOA Characteristics




Figure 9. Turn-on Characteristics vs.
Gate Resistance




Figure 10. Turn-off Characteristics vs.
Gate Resistance




Figure 11. Turn-on Characteristics vs.
Collector Current




Figure 12. Turn-off Characteristics vs.




Figure 13. Switching Loss vs. Gate Resistance




Figure 14. Switching Loss vs. Collector Current




Figure 15. Forward Characteristics




Figure 16. Reverse Recovery Current




Figure 17. Reverse Recovery Time




Figure 18. Stored Charge




Figure 19. Transient Thermal Impedance of IGBT






Figure 20. Transient Thermal Impedance of Diode



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
