


Figure 1. Startup Timing (OE/ST Mode)






Figure 2. Standby Resume Timing (ST Mode Only)

Figure 3. OE Enable Timing (OE Mode Only)


Figure 4. OE Disable Timing (OE Mode Only)








Figure 1. Reliability Comparison^[1]




Figure 2. Aging Comparison^[2]




Figure 3. Electro Magnetic Susceptibility (EMS)[3]




Figure 4. Power Supply Noise Rejection^[4]




Figure 5. Vibration Robustness^[5]




Figure 6. Shock Robustness^[6]
