


Radiation Characteristics 8)


Electrical Internal Circuit

Component Location on Pad





Moisture-sensitive product is packed in a dry bag containing desiccant and a humidity card according JEDEC-STD-033.

- Reverse Operation: Reverse Operation of 10 hours is permissible in total. Continuous reverse operation is not allowed.
