



Fig.2 Typical Output Characteristics(II)




Fig.3 Breakdown Voltage vs.

Junction Temperature





Fig.4 Typical Transfer Characteristics

Junction Temperature




Fig.6 Forward Transfer Admittance vs. Drain Current




Fig.7 Drain Current Derating Curve




Fig.8 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Gate Source Voltage





Fig.9 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature

Resistance vs. Drain Current (I)








Fig.11 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (II)




Fig.12 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (III)







Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (IV)

Fig.17 Dynamic Input Characteristics




Fig.16 Switching Characteristics





Fig.18 Source Current vs. Source Drain Voltage

Reverse Voltage





Fig.20 Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage

Fig. 1-1 SWITCHING TIME MEASUREMENT CIRCUIT




Fig. 2-1 GATE CHARGE MEASUREMENT CIRCUIT




Fig. 1-2 SWITCHING WAVEFORMS






Fig. 2-2 GATE CHARGE WAVEFORM



Notice

- SBD has a large reverse leak current compared to other type of diode. Therefore, it would raise a junction temperature, and increase a reverse power loss. Further rise of inside temperature would cause a thermal runaway. This built-in SBD has low V_F characteristics and therefore, higher leak current. Please consider enough the surrounding temperature, generating heat of MOSFET and the reverse current.
- 2. This product might cause chip aging and breakdown under the large electrified environment. Please consider to design ESD protection circuit.
