



Fig.1 Power Dissipation Derating Curve




Fig.2 Maximum Safe Operating Area




Fig.3 Normalized Transient Thermal Resistance vs. Pulse Width




Fig.4 Single Pulse Maximum Power dissipation




Fig.5 Typical Output Characteristics(I)





Fig.6 Typical Output Characteristics(II)

Junction Temperature




Fig.8 Typical Transfer Characteristics




Fig.9 Gate Threshold Voltage vs.

Junction Temperature





Fig.10 Forward Transfer Admittance vs.

Fig.11 Drain Current Derating Curve




Fig.12 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Gate Source Voltage




Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature




Fig.14 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current(I)




Fig.15 Static Drain - Source On - State
Resistance vs. Drain Current(II)




Fig.16 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current(III)




Fig.17 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current(IV)




Fig.18 Typical Capacitance vs.

Drain - Source Voltage




Fig.19 Switching Characteristics




Fig.20 Dynamic Input Characteristics





Fig.21 Source Current vs.

Fig.1-1 Switching Time Measurement Circuit




Fig.2-1 Gate Charge Measurement Circuit




Fig.1-2 Switching Waveforms






Fig.2-2 Gate Charge Waveform

- 1. If change is made to the constant of an external circuit, please allow a sufficient margin considering variations of the characteristics of the Products and external components, including transient characteristics, as well as static characteristics.
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#### **Precaution for Electrostatic**

This Product is electrostatic sensitive product, which may be damaged due to electrostatic discharge. Please take proper caution in your manufacturing process and storage so that voltage exceeding the Products maximum rating will not be applied to Products. Please take special care under dry condition (e.g. Grounding of human body / equipment / solder iron, isolation from charged objects, setting of lonizer, friction prevention and temperature / humidity control).

#### **Precaution for Storage / Transportation**

- 1. Product performance and soldered connections may deteriorate if the Products are stored in the places where:
  - [a] the Products are exposed to sea winds or corrosive gases, including Cl2, H2S, NH3, SO2, and NO2
  - [b] the temperature or humidity exceeds those recommended by ROHM
  - [c] the Products are exposed to direct sunshine or condensation
  - [d] the Products are exposed to high Electrostatic
- Even under ROHM recommended storage condition, solderability of products out of recommended storage time period
