





Figure 1. Output Characteristics T_J = -40 °C

Figure 2. Output Characteristics T_J = 25 °C







Figure 3. Output Characteristics T_J = 175 °C

Figure 4. Normalized On-Resistance vs. Temperature







Figure 5. On-Resistance vs. Drain Current For Various Temperatures

Figure 6. On-Resistance vs. Temperature For Various Gate Voltage







Figure 7. Transfer Characteristic for Various Junction Temperatures

Figure 8. Body Diode Characteristic at -40 °C







Figure 9. Body Diode Characteristic at 25 °C

Figure 10. Body Diode Characteristic at 175 °C







Figure 11. Threshold Voltage vs. Temperature

Figure 12. Gate Charge Characteristics







Figure 13. 3rd Quadrant Characteristic at -40 °C

Figure 14. 3rd Quadrant Characteristic at 25 °C







Figure 15. 3rd Quadrant Characteristic at 175 °C

Figure 16. Output Capacitor Stored Energy







Figure 17. Capacitances vs. Drain-Source Voltage (0 - 200V)

Figure 18. Capacitances vs. Drain-Source Voltage (0 - 650V)







Figure 19. Continuous Drain Current Derating vs.

Figure 20. Maximum Power Dissipation Derating vs. Case Temperature







Figure 21. Transient Thermal Impedance (Junction - Case)

Figure 22. Safe Operating Area






Figure 23. Clamped Inductive Switching Energy vs. Low Drain Current ($V_{\rm DD} = 400 V$)




Figure 25. Clamped Inductive Switching Energy vs. $R_{G(ext)}$





Figure 27. Switching Times vs. $R_{G(ext)}$

Temperature




Figure 28. Switching Times Definition






Figure 29. Clamped Inductive Switching Waveform Test Circuit
