Introduction

H Series[™], an ultra-high lumen density COB product line, is designed for high intensity spotlights used in commercial and retail settings. H series arrays offer industry leading color over angle uniformity, and replace ceramic metal halide lamps by providing equal or greater center beam candle power at lower power and at greater lifetimes. Their tight beam control and exceptional quality of light is well suited for demanding directional spot applications.

H Series LEDs are available in a variety of CCT and CRI combinations, including Décor Series Class A, a revolutionary advancement in lighting designed to match how humans perceive and prefer light, and Décor Series Ultra. Décor Series Ultra offers a high CRI of 97 and emphasizes reds and color tones to which the human eye is most receptive. Typical applications for H Series LEDs include but are not limited to commercial and residential down lights, accent, spot & track lights.




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

10. Typical performance is estimated based on operation under DC (direct current) with LED array mounted onto a heat sink with thermal interface material and the case temperature maintained at 85°C. 11. Minimum flux values at elevated temperatures are provided for reference only and are not guaranteed by 100% production testing. Values may vary depending on the thermal design of the luminaire and/or the exposed environment to which the product is subjected.

Performance at Commonly Used Drive Currents


Figure 2: Efficacy vs. Flux ($T_j = T_c = 25^{\circ}C$; BXRH-30E6000-G-23)





Figure 4: Typical Relative Luminous Flux vs. Drive Current ($T_i = T_c = 25^{\circ}C$)

H Series LED arrays are tested to the specifications shown using the nominal drive currents in Table 1. H Series arrays may also be driven at other drive currents depending on specific application design requirements. The performance at any drive current can be derived from the efficacy vs. flux characteristics in Figure 2, the current vs. voltage characteristics shown in Figure 3 and the flux vs. current characteristics shown in Figure 4. The performance at commonly used drive currents is summarized in Table 3.



- Bridgelux recommends a maximum duty cycle of 10% and pulse width of 20 ms when operating LED Arrays at maximum peak pulsed current specified. Maximum peak pulsed currents indicate values where LED Arrays can be driven without catastrophic failures.
- 7. Light emitting diodes are not designed to be driven in reverse voltage and will not produce light under this condition. Maximum rating provided for reference only.

The maximum allowable drive current for the H12 family of products is dependent on the operating case temperature. Please refer to the Product Feature Map (page 2) for the location of the Tc measurement point.



Figure 3: Drive Current vs. Voltage ($T_i = T_c = 25^{\circ}C$)

Figure 5: Typical DC Flux vs. Case Temperature







Figure 6: Typical DC ccy Shift vs. Case Temperature




Figure 8: Typical Spatial Radiation Pattern



Figure 9: Typical Color Spectrum






Figure 11: Graph of Warm and Neutral White Test Bins in xy Color Space

- 2. One tube is sealed in an anti-static bag. Four such bags are placed in a box and shipped. Depending on quantities ordered, a bigger shipping box, containing four boxes will be used to ship products.
- 3. Each bag and box is to be labeled as shown above.
- 4. Dimensions for each tube are 20.4 (W) x 9.5(H) x 479 mm. Dimensions for the anti-static bag are 75 (W) x 615 (L) x 3.1 (T) mm and that of a shipping box are 58.7 x 13.3 x 7.9 cm.

Do not touch the H Series LED array during operation. Allow the array to cool for a sufficient period of time before handling. The H Series LED array may reach elevated temperatures such that could burn skin when touched.
