About this document

Scope and purpose

This user guide provides an overview of the evaluation board EVAL-M1-05F310R including its main features, key data, pin assignments and mechanical dimensions.

EVAL-M1-05F310R is a power evaluation board from the modular application design kit including M1 connector, which is the iMOTION™ standard interface, and three CIPOS™ Nano 100 V half-bridge modules for motor drive applications. In combination with either EVAL-M1-101T or other control boards with M1 connector compatible, it features and demonstrates Infineon's CIPOS™ Nano IPM technology for motor drives.

The evaluation board EVAL-M1-05F310R was developed to support customers during their first steps designing applications with IRSM005-301MH CIPOS™ Nano power modules.

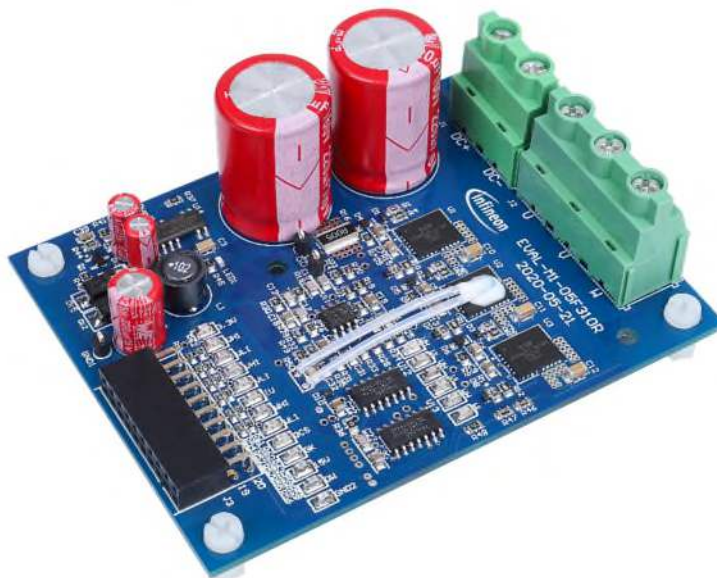
Intended audience

This user guide is intended for all technical specialists who know motor control, middle- and low-power electronics converters. The board is intended to be used under laboratory conditions.

Evaluation Board

This board will be used during design in, for evaluation and measurement of characteristics, and proof of data sheet specifications.

Note: PCB and auxiliary circuits are NOT optimized for final customer design.

1 The board at a glance

The EVAL-M1-05F310R evaluation board is a part of the iMOTION™ MADK for motor control (iMOTION™ MADK).

The MADK platform is intended for use in various power stages with different control boards. These boards can easily be interfaced through the 20-pin iMOTION™ MADK - M1 interface connector.

This evaluation board is designed to give comprehensible solutions for the power section featuring by CIPOS™ Nano. It provides a DC input and 3-phase output for power. It contains a single shunt for current sensing and a voltage divider for DC-link voltage measurement.

The EVAL-M1-05F310R evaluation board is available from Infineon. The features of this board are described in the design feature chapter of this document (UG-2020-24), whereas the remaining paragraphs provide information to enable the customers to copy, modify and qualify the design for production according to their own specific requirements.

Environmental conditions were considered in the design of the EVAL-M1-05F310R. The design was tested as described in this document but not qualified in term of safety requirements or manufacturing and operation over the whole operating temperature range or lifetime. The boards provided by Infineon are subject to functional testing only.

1.1 Delivery content

The EVAL-M1-05F310R evaluation board is designed to provide an ease-of-use power stage based on the Infineon's CIPOS™ Nano intelligent power module (IRSM005-301MH).

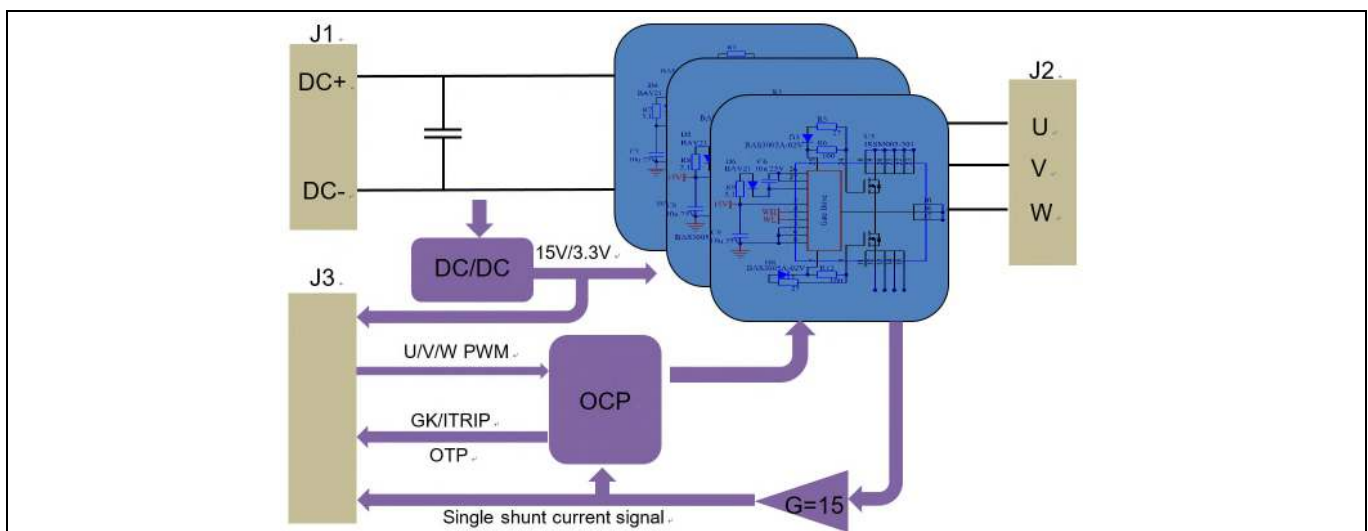


Figure 1 The block diagram of EVAL-M1-05F310R

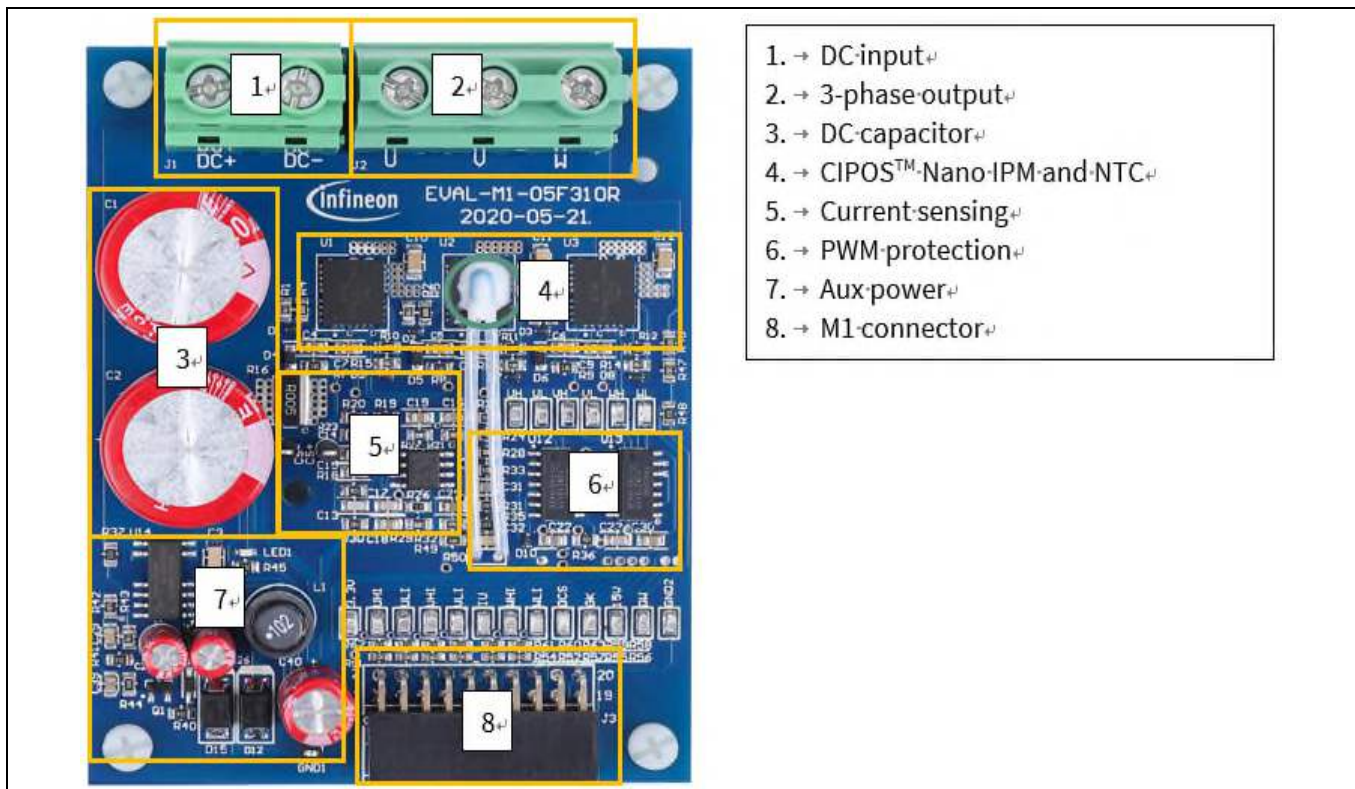


Figure 2 Functional groups of the EVAL-M1-05F310E reference design

The delivery includes the finished board as shown in Figure 1 and Figure 2. It provides a 3-phase AC connector, an EMI filter and soft power-up circuit, input rectifier, DC bus capacitors and 3-phase output for connecting the motor.

It also CoolSET™ based aux power supply to provide 15V and 3.3 V, a single shunt for current sensing and over-current protection, and a voltage divider for DC-link voltage measurement. The board shown here can be operated directly with the required power supply without the need for additional components.

1.2 Block diagram

The block diagram of EVAL-M1-05F310R is depicted in Figure 1.

1.3 Main features

EVAL-M1-05F310R is a complete power evaluation board including 3 half bridge IPMs for motor drive application. The kit demonstrates Infineon's IPM technology for motor drives. Main features of CIPOS™ Nano intelligent power module IRSM005-301MH include:

- MOSFET drain-to-source voltage 100 V
- Maximum DC current at 25°C case temperature $I_D = 30$ A
- Package with low thermal resistance and minimal parasitic inductance
- Independent gate driver in phase with logic input
- Gate driver supply is 15 V
- 3.3 V logic input compatible
- Undervoltage lockout protection inside the driver
- Exposed driver outputs and HEXFET gate terminals for dv/dt setting via a resistor.

Note: For iMOTION™ IC IMCxxx, there are three types of Gatekill input source options in MCEWizard setup: Gatekill-pin, Comparator and Both. If you select “comparator” mode, the external Gatekill signal will be not used, and the signal I_Shunt will be compared by the internal comparator with the “Device over-current trigger level setting” value set in MCEWizard.

2 System and functional description

2.1 Getting started with EVAL-M1-05F310R

In order to run the motor system, a combination of the iMOTION™ MADK power board (EVAL-M1-05F310R) and the matching MADK control board (EVAL-M1-101T or other control board) are required. This chapter provides more details on setting up the system and getting started with the iMOTION™ MADK development platform.

The EVAL-M1-05F310R reference designs are tested with EVAL-M1-101T controller boards, which shipped with embedded firmware and default parameters.

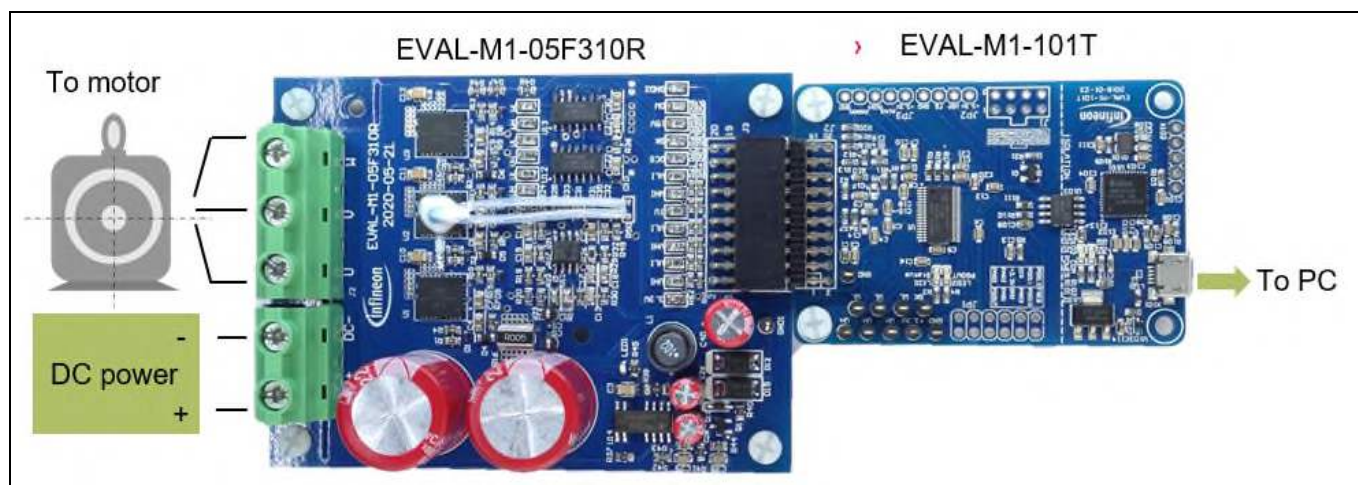


Figure 3 System connection example

Figure 3 shows the basic system connection using EVAL-M1-05F310R to run a motor with MCEDesigner.

2.1.1 iMOTION™ control board

1. If you want to use the Infineon control board, please go to the Infineon website, www.infineon.com/MADK, and order EVAL-M1-101T.
2. Then get the latest “IMC101T-T038 MCE Software Package” available on the website, <http://www.infineon.com/imotion-software>.
3. After you have obtained the control board and software, you are ready to connect your PC to EVAL-M1-101T via USB cable, and to program and tune the control board.
4. Connect EVAL-M1-101T’s M1 20-pin interface connector (J2) to power board (for example EVAL-M1-05F310R, see Figure 3).
5. Use MCEWizard to enter the target motor’s system and operating parameters, as well as the evaluation board’s hardware parameters, which will then be used to calculate the controller’s set digital parameters representing the complete motor drive system. First click the “Calculate” button on the “Verify & Save Page” and then save the drive parameter set into your project directory by clicking “Export to Designer file (.txt)”. The saved drive system parameter file will be later used by the MCEDesigner. Refer to Chapter 2.1.3 or MCEWizard user guide for more details.
6. Connect motor phase outputs to the motor.
7. Connect DC power to power input connector and power-on system.
8. Start MCEDesigner tool and open MCEDesigner default configuration file (.irc) for IMC101T-T038 controller (IMC101T_Vxxx.irc) by clicking “File” > “Open”. IMC101T_Vxxx.irc file is included in the “IMC101T-T038 MCE Software Package” downloaded in step 2.

9. MCEDesigner should automatically connect to the EVAL-M1-101T control board using default COM port (indicated by green circle next to “COMx Up” status in the bottom frame of the MCEDesigner GUI). If it cannot establish the connection, change the COM port as follows: (“System” window active) > Preferences > Connection > Connect using (select one of the other available COM ports from the drop-down menu).
10. Use the following steps to program the system parameters into the internal SRAM of iMOTION™ IC: Click “Tools” > “Programmer” and select “Program Parameters.” Browse and select the System Drive Parameters .txt file created in step 5. See Chapter 2.1.3 for more details.
11. Start the motor by clicking the green traffic light button in the control bar.
12. Stop the motor by clicking the red traffic light button in the control bar.

2.1.2 iMOTION™ development tools and software

The iMOTION™ development tool installers for MCEDesigner and MCEWizard are available for download via Infineon iMOTION™ website (<http://www.infineon.com/imotion-software>). All supported tools and software variants are listed there. Please visit this page periodically to check for tool/software updates.

The isolated on-board debugger provides the USB-to-UART bridge between the PC and the target iMOTION™ device with 1 kV DC galvanic isolation between the motor drive system (hot side) and the PC/debugger (cold) side. The on-board debugger uses the SEGGER J-Link driver for UART communication with IMC101T-T038. The J-Link driver will be installed during the MCEDesigner installation. In case the driver is not installed properly, please go to the SEGGER J-Link website to download and install the latest J-Link “Software and Documentation pack for Windows.”

2.1.3 MCEWizard setup overview

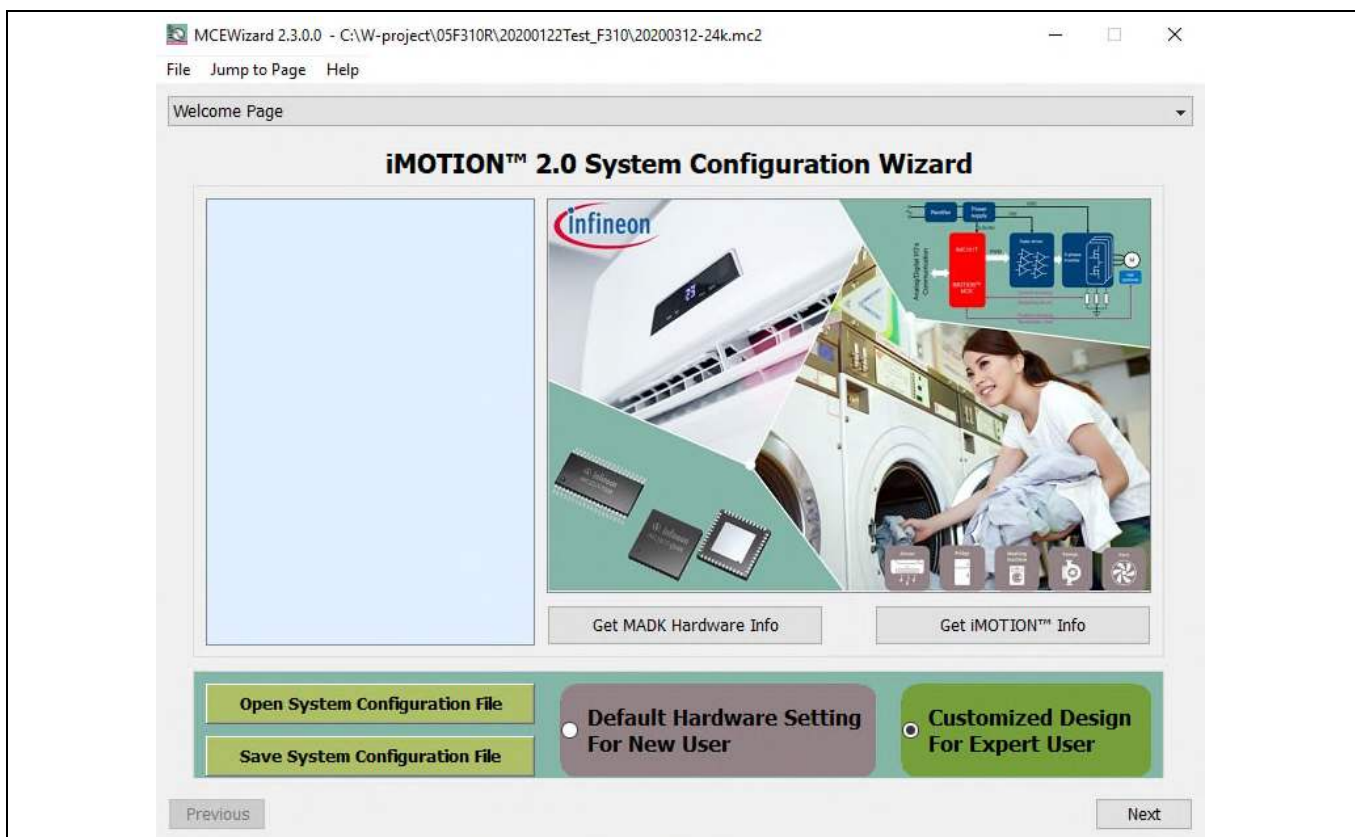


Figure 4 Welcome page of MCEWizard

Double-click the shortcut to open the MCEWizard and configure the parameters for evaluation boards or motor. Figure 4 shows the “Welcome Page” for MCEWizard, where the MADK control board or power board can be selected from the pull-down list. Infineon continues to release new MADK controller and power boards. Therefore, it is possible that some of the latest power boards have not been pre-configured in the MCEWizard tool and cannot be selected from the pull-down menu. In that case, the user should select another power board (as similar as possible) and follow the MCEWizard setup steps by entering the parameter values that are specific to the chosen board. Make sure both “I have modified the circuit board” and “Enable advanced question” checkmarks are selected. Please refer to the Application Note of the corresponding power board for additional information.

After selecting the MADK control and the power board, start the MCEWizard system setup procedure by clicking the “Next” button in the right bottom corner as shown in Figure 4.

The iMOTION™ MADK system enables users to easily test different combinations of control and power boards with their motors. Users should be familiar with the system level parameters that are related to the motor used. There is a very limited number of parameters which are specific to the control board or power board hardware. Table 3 provides the MCEWizard setup overview for hardware related parameters specific to EVAL-M1-05F310R power board. Similar tables will be available in each control board’s Application Note. A combination of this table and the corresponding table of the control board provides sufficient information to set up the MADK-based motor drive system rapidly.

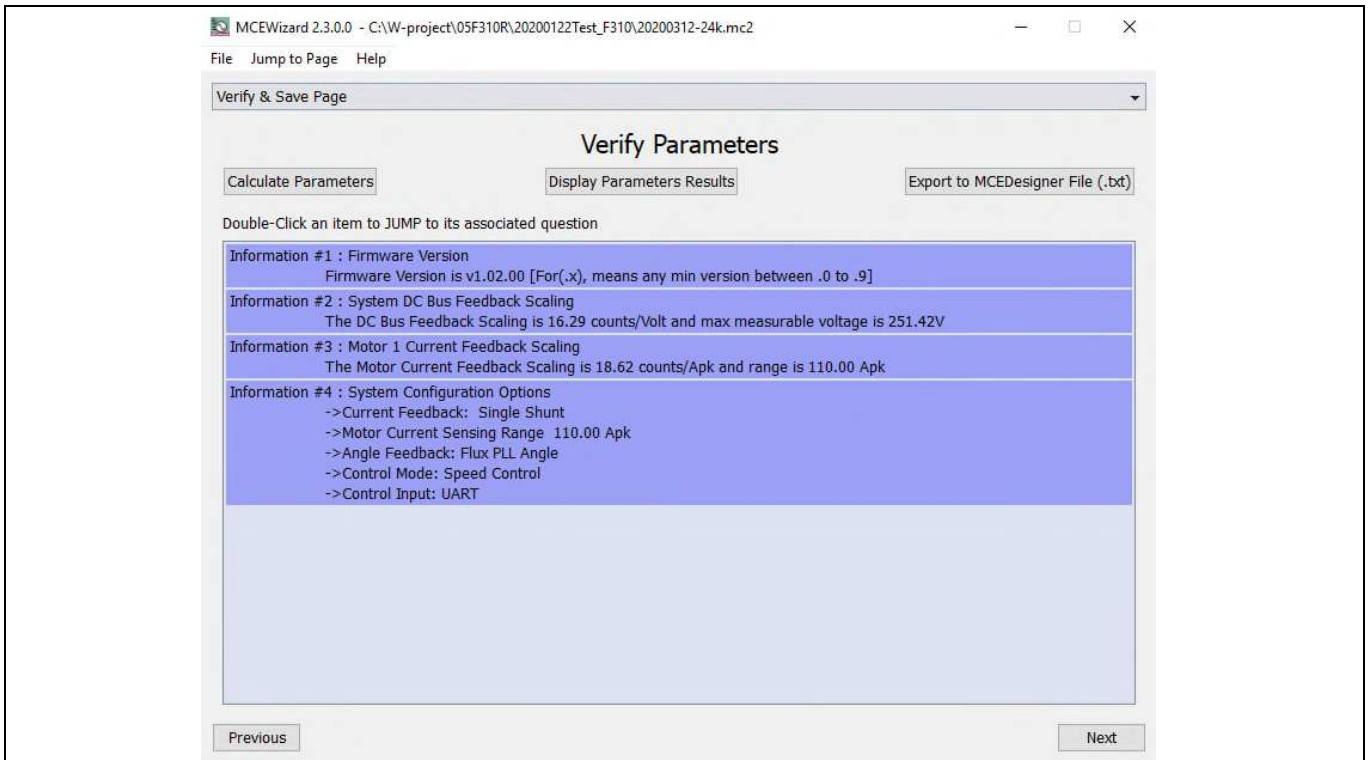


Figure 5 Verify and save page of the MCEWizard

After all the MCEWizard questions are answered, the “Verify & Save Page” will be shown as in Figure 5.

Click “Calculate Parameters” button and “Export to Designer File (.txt)” button to save the parameter file which will be used by the MCEDesigner in the next steps.

2.1.4 MCEDesigner setup overview

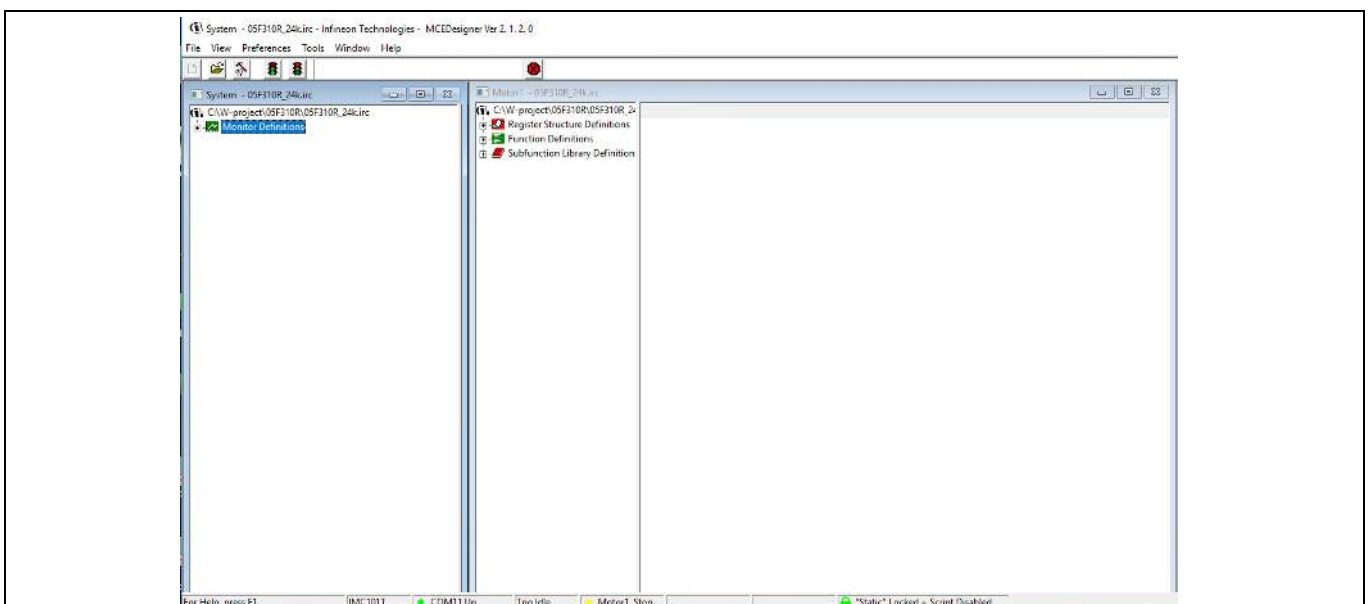


Figure 6 MCEDesigner’s main display for EVAL-M1-101T

After installing MCEDesigner, there is a shortcut for the MCEDesigner on Windows desktop. Double-click the shortcut to open MCEDesigner and then open “IMC101T_xx.irc” file as shown in Figure 6.

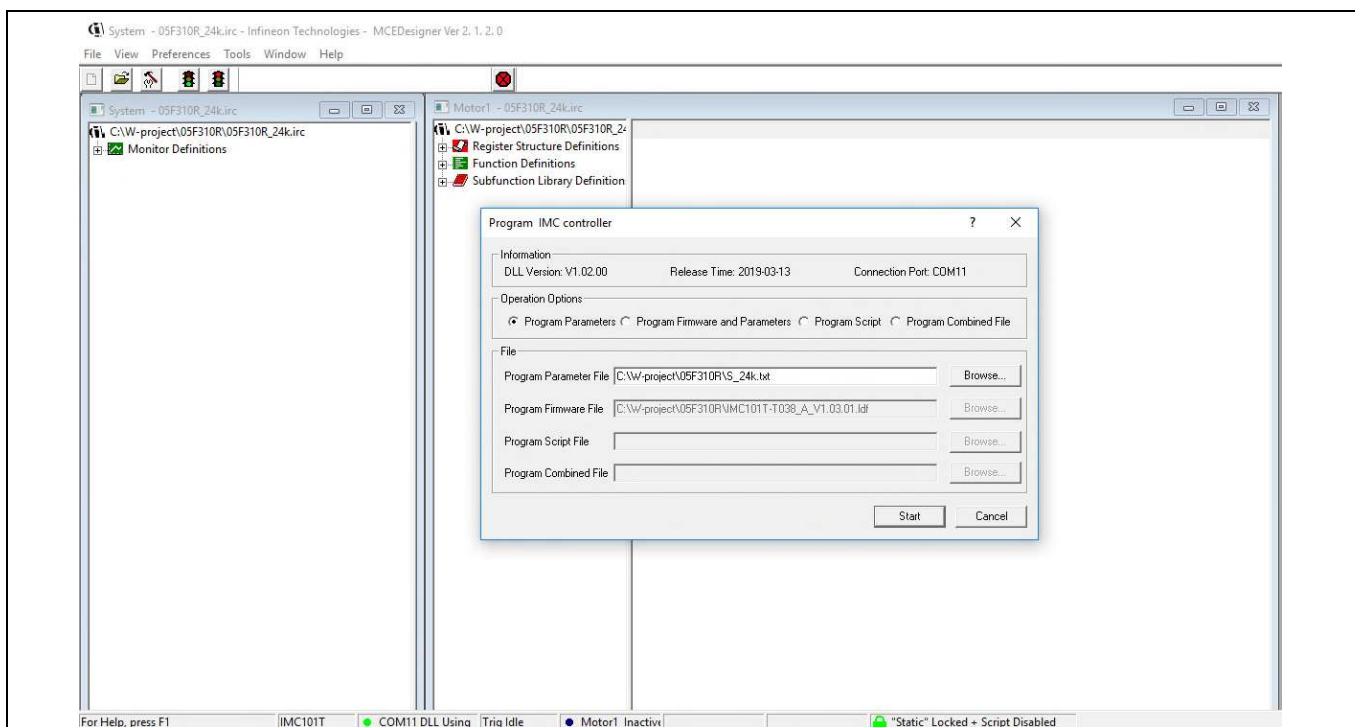


Figure 7 “Program IMC controller” pop-up window

After the drive system parameter file has been programmed into the IMC101 controller, and the motor drive system is powered, the MCEDesigner can be used to start/stop the motor, display motor current traces, change the motor speed, modify drive parameters and many other functions. Please refer to the MCEDesigner documentation for more details.

Note: The on-board debugger section of the EVAL-M1-101T has galvanic isolation from the controller section and the attached power board. In order to program the parameters or firmware to the IMC101T-T038 controller, the 3.3 V DC voltage needs to be supplied to the controller section of the EVAL-M1-101T. This voltage can either be supplied by the power board (MADK power boards are designed to supply the 3.3 V to the control board via M1 or M3 connector) or by feeding the 3.3 V voltage to the control board via some of the available 3.3 V access/test points if the power board is not attached to the EVAL-M1-101T control board.

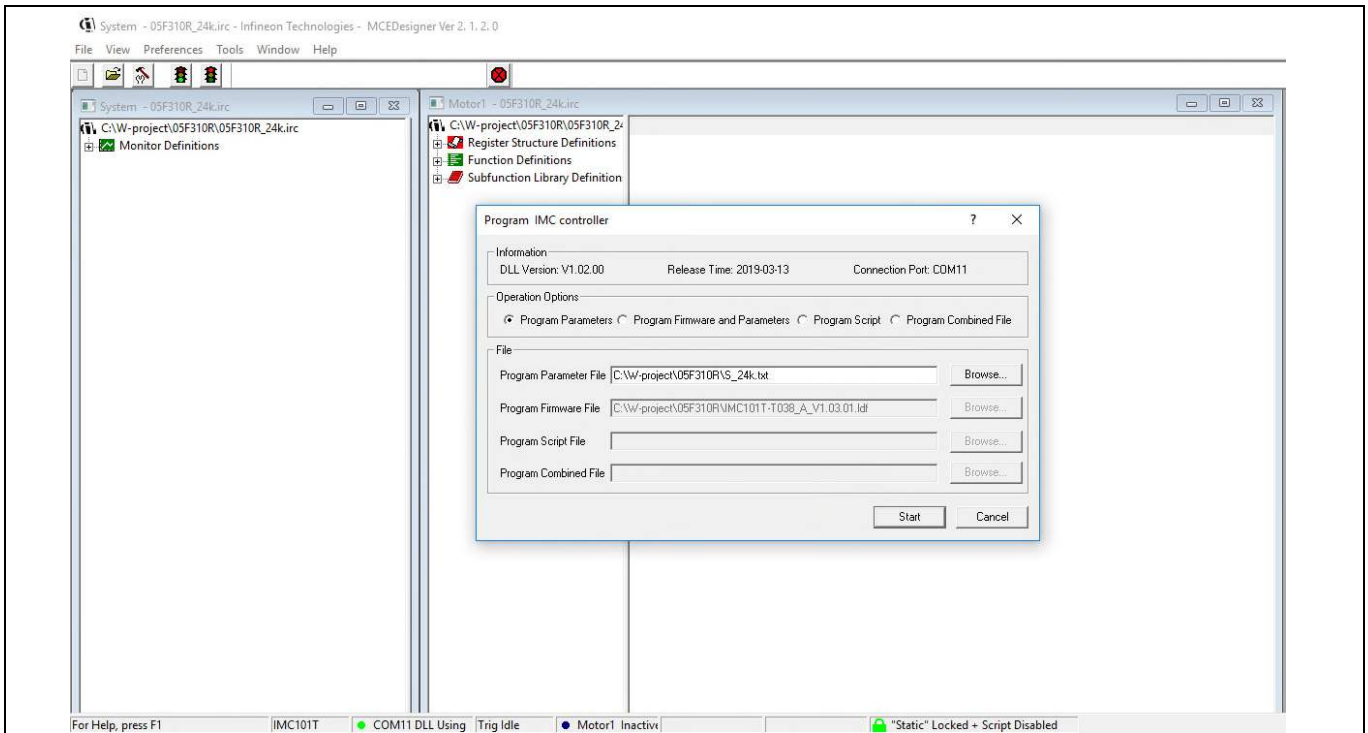


Figure 8 Program firmware and parameter in “Program IMC controller” pop-up window

To program new firmware and the drive system parameters into IMC101T-T038, please click the “Tools” menu and select “Programmer” in the pull-down list. The pop-up window “Program IMC controller” will show up as in Figure 8. Click on the “Program Firmware and Parameter” radio button, and select the “Drive System Parameter” file created using MCEWizard by clicking on the “Browse” button on the row of “Program Parameter File”, and then select the firmware file by clicking on the “Browse” button in the row of “Program Firmware File”. Finally, click on the “Start” button to program the parameter file into the IMC101T-T038 IC.

2.2 The current waveform form MCEdesigner

MCEdesigner has a parameter trace function for debugging and checking the PCB layout/parameter settings in the “.irc” window.

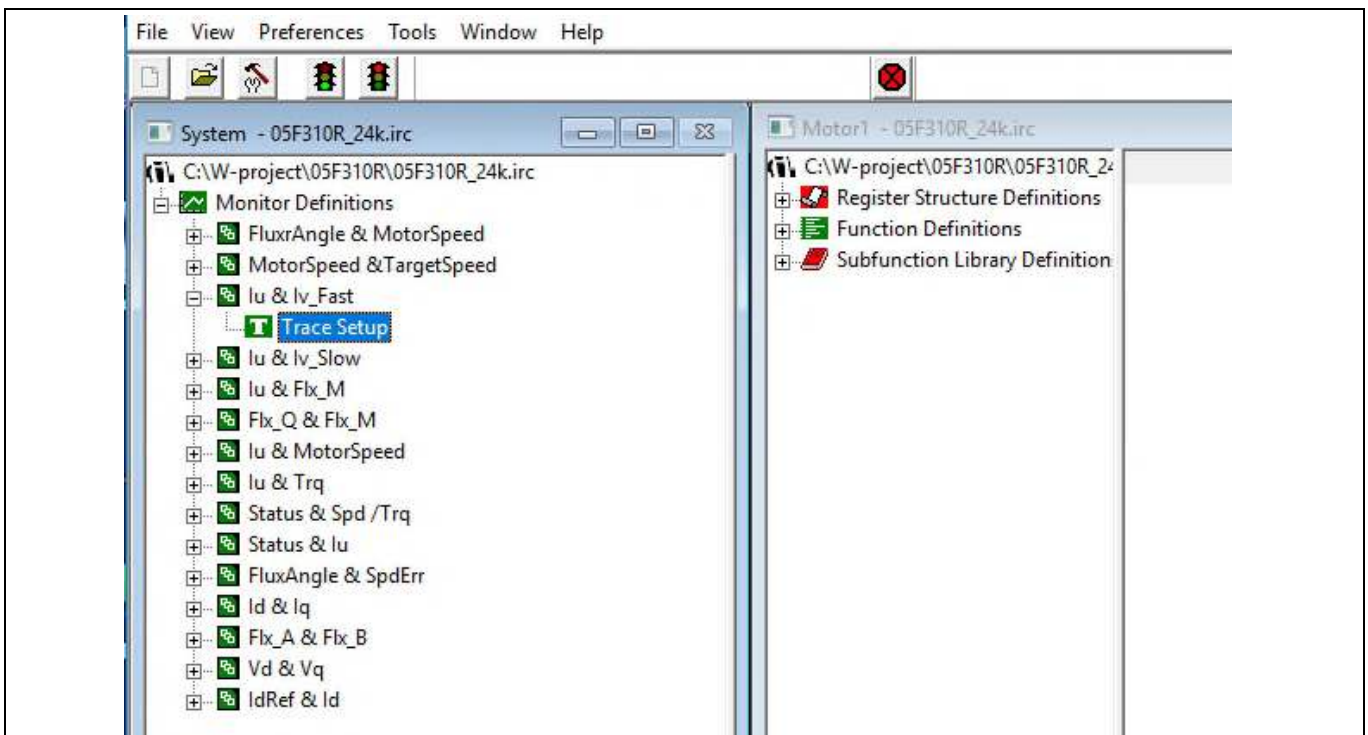


Figure 9 Trace function in MCEdesigner window

The trace function shows what the MCE 'saw'. The figures below are the motor current waveform at stop and running status.

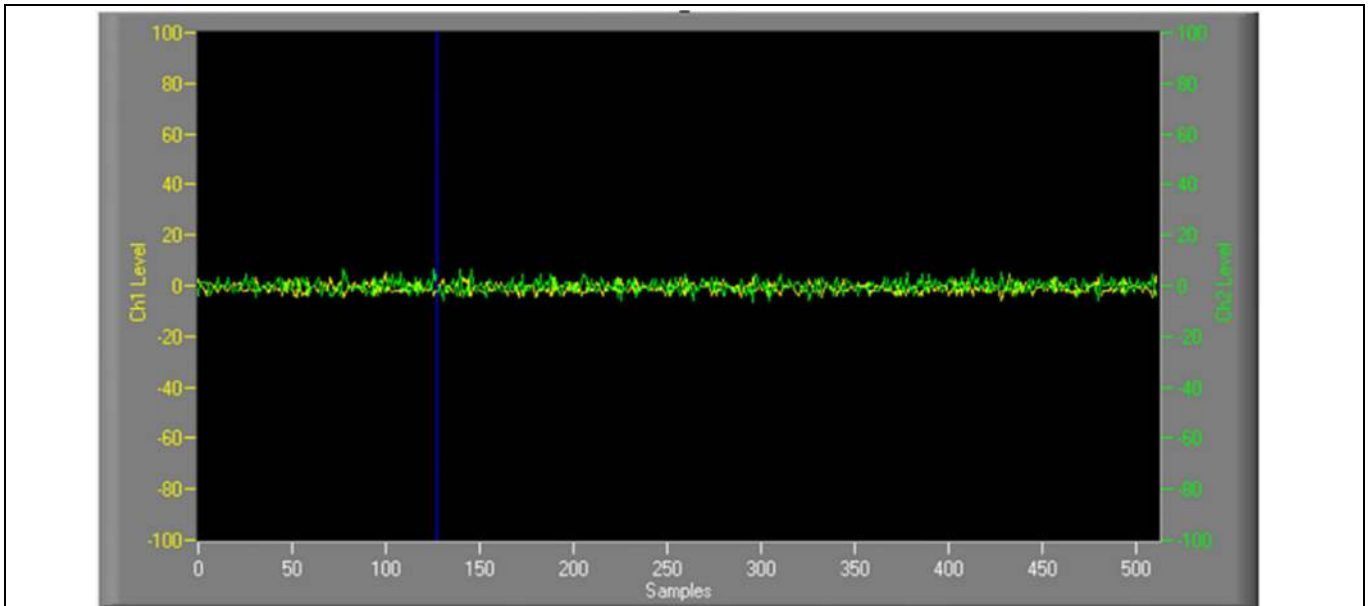


Figure 10 Iu and Iv static noise waveform from MCEDesigner

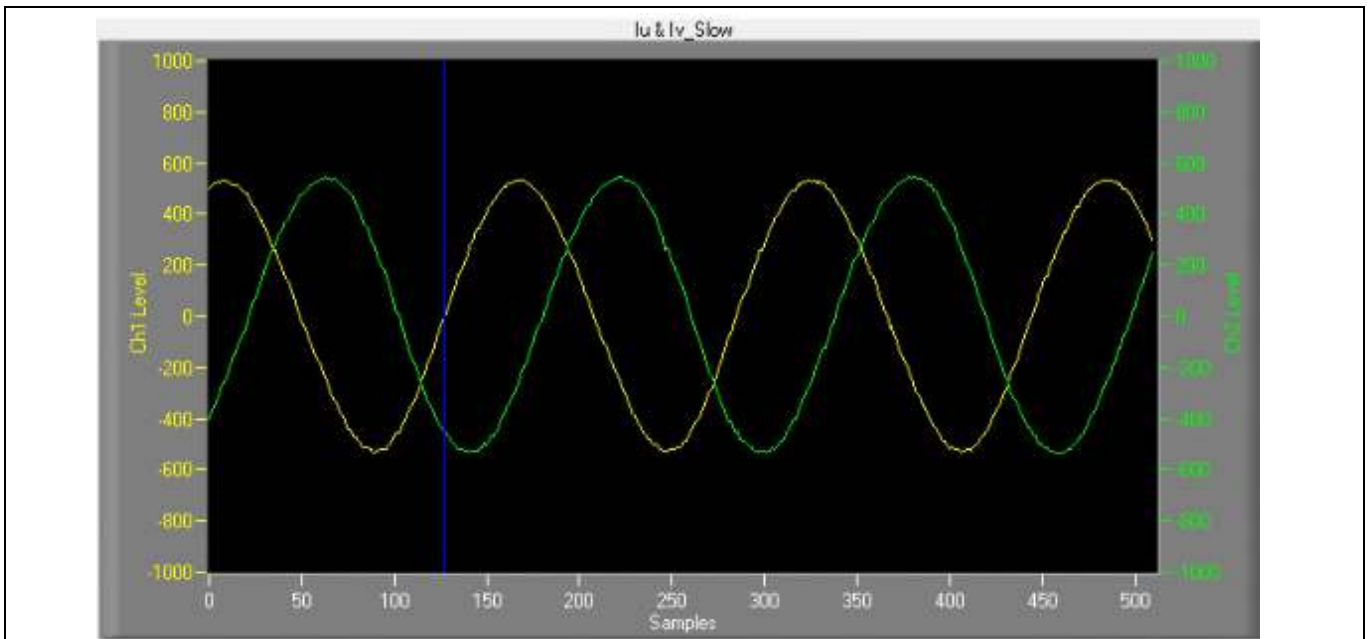


Figure 11 Iu and Iv waveform from MCEDesigner @ Iu and Iv @ Io=5.7 A, 48 VDC , 24 kHz

This is typical current waveform of a sinusoidal brushless motor driven by the EVAL-M1-05F310R and EVAL-M1-101T with iMOTION™ software.

2.3 Description of the functional blocks

The motor inverter of EVAL-M1-05F310R evaluation design is implemented by the IRSM005-301MH module, and the auxiliary power supply is based on the CoolSET™: ICE5GR4780AG.

System and functional description

2.3.1 Overview of IRSM005-301MH

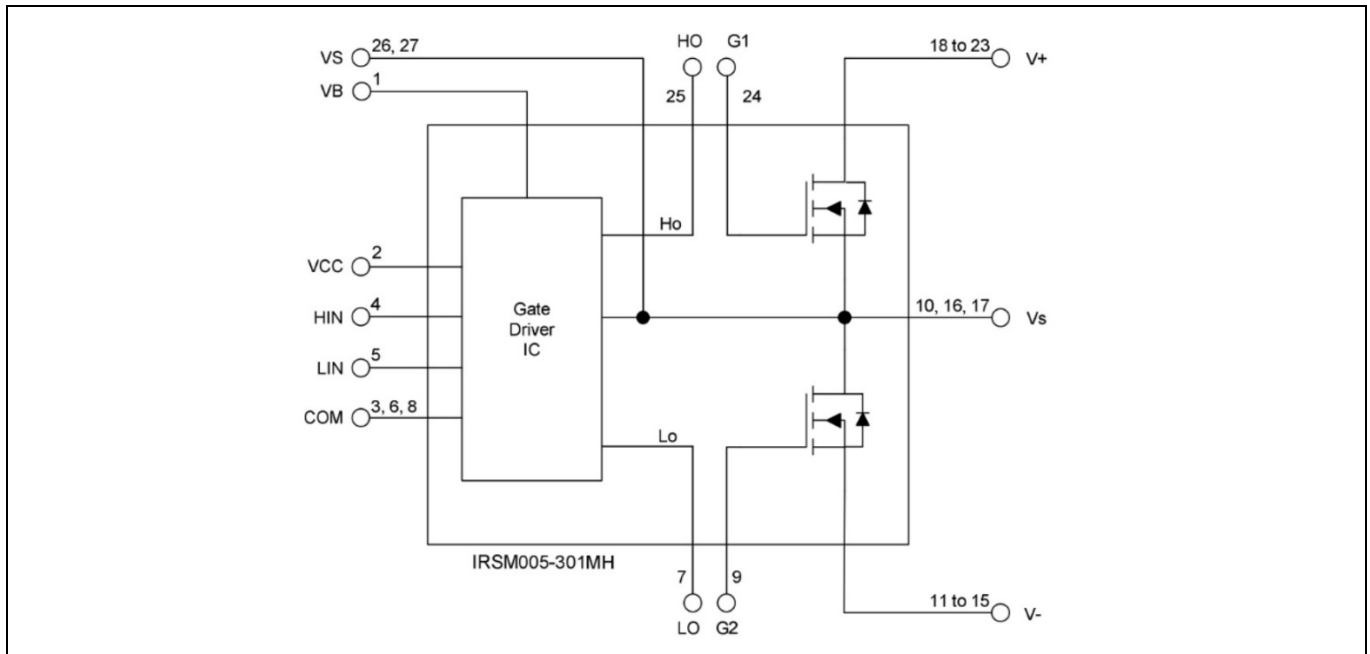


Figure 12 IRSM005-301MH internal electrical schematic

Figure 12 provides the overview of the IRSM005-301MH internal electrical schematics. For further information regarding these CIPOS™ Nano such as static and dynamic electrical behavior, as well as thermal and mechanical characteristics, please refer to the datasheet of the IRSM005-301MH.

2.3.2 Overview of ICE5GR4780AG

The ICE5GR4780AG is single power chip that is Infineon's CoolSET™, offers high performance, high efficiency and easy to use with DC 30~600 V super wide voltage range industrial auxiliary power supply for super buck with DC 36 ~ 540 V standard industrial aided design.

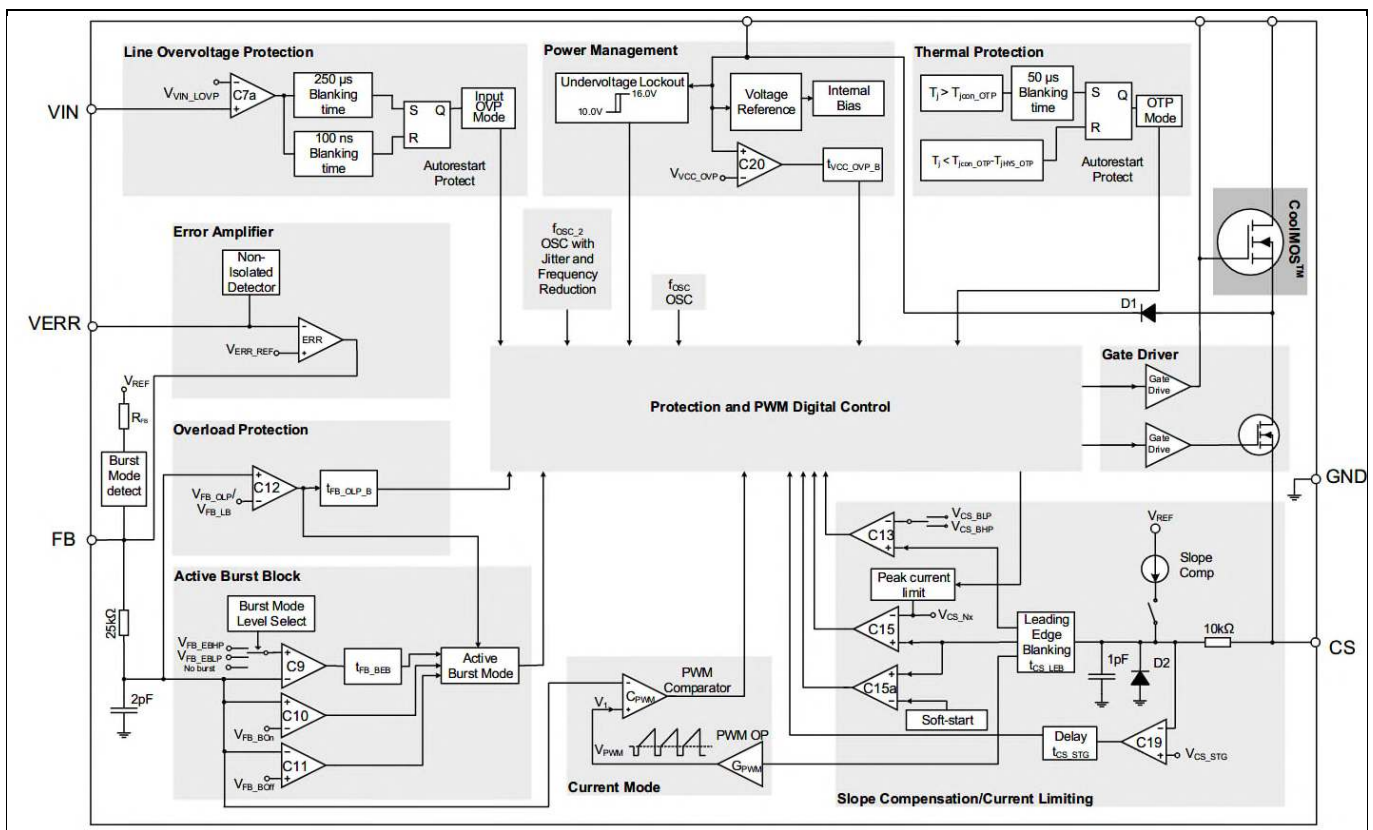


Figure 13 ICE5GR4780AG internal electrical schematic

System design

3 System design

The EVAL-M1-05F310R board is an optimized design for DC30~72V major home and industry appliances. To meet individual customer's requirements and to make the EVAL-M1-05F310R evaluation design a basis for development or modification, all board design data such as schematics, Gerber and Altium design data can be found on the Infineon homepage and log in your account to download them.

3.1 Inverter section using CIPOS™ Nano

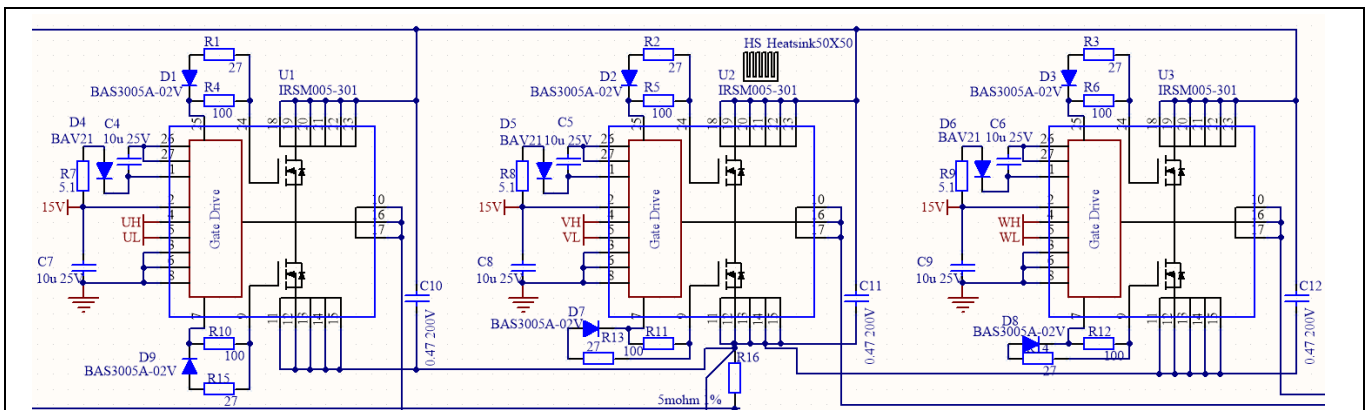


Figure 14 Schematic of the inverter section

Three CIPOS™ Nanos are used to build up the inverter section as shown in Figure 14. Three half-bridge modules are used as the 3-phase inverter bridge section. Every half-bridge module includes two power MOSFETs and one half-bridge gate driver. The shunt resistor section is also given. The three capacitors C4, C5 and C6 are used as bootstrap capacitors to provide the necessary floating supply voltages VBU, VBV and VBW respectively.

3.2 DC to DC power converter

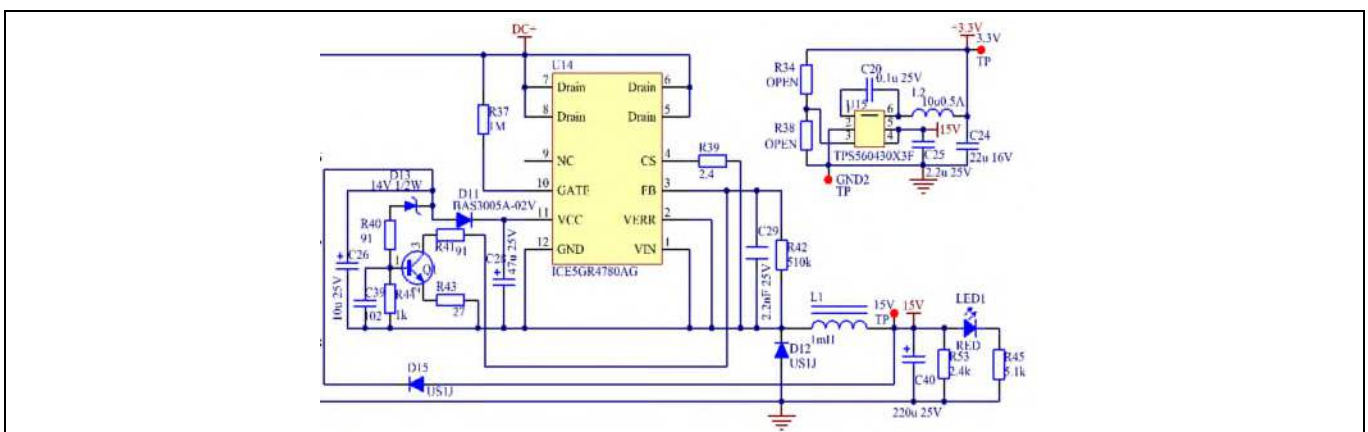


Figure 15 Power supply section

Figure 15 depicts the schematic of the super buck for auxiliary power supply available on the EVAL-M1-05F310R board. The circuit includes ICE5GR4780AG that is used to generate 15 V (VCC) directly from the DC bus. VCC is connect to the gate drivers inside the CIPOS™ Nano. The linear regulator TPS56043XF generates 3.3 V from VCC. The 3.3 V power supply is used in the overcurrent comparator circuit. Red LED1 is used to signal whether the board is powered or not. Both, VCC and 3.3 V are also present on the 20-pin interface connector J3 to power circuitry on the controller board.

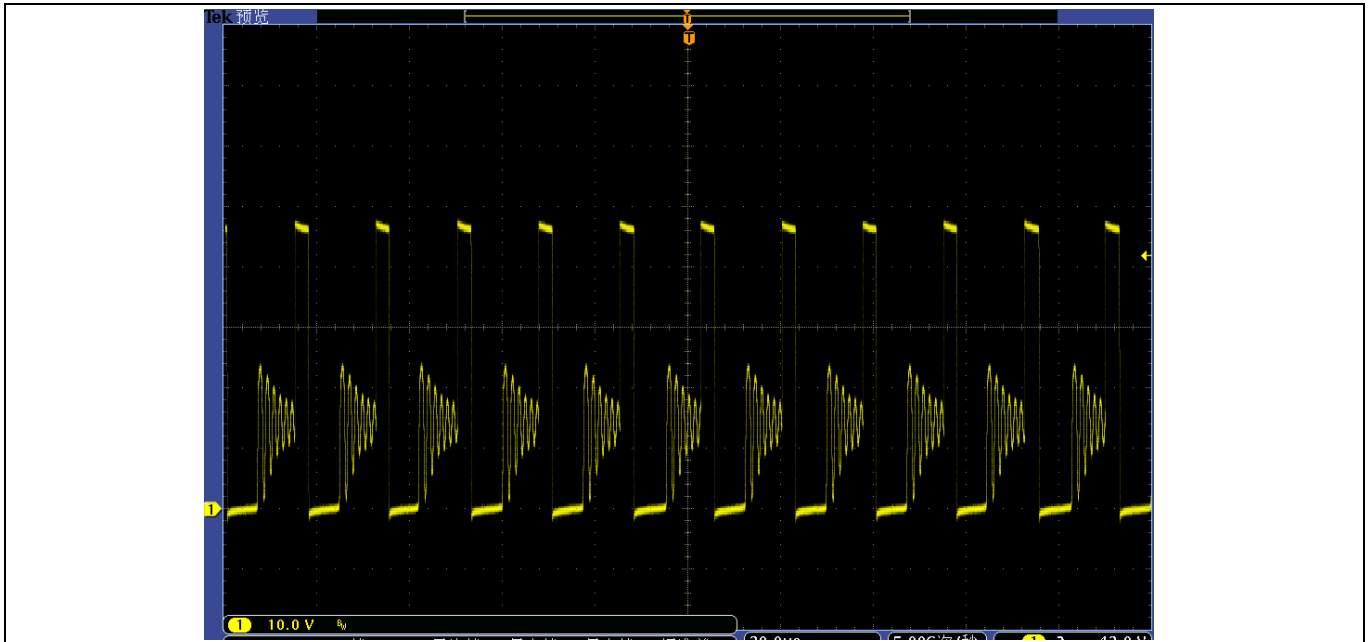


Figure 16 U14 (Pin12) output type waveform at 48 V DC input

3.3 DC bus voltage measurement

Pin 14 of connector J3 provides access to the DC bus voltage. Three possible feedback cases are associated with this pin.

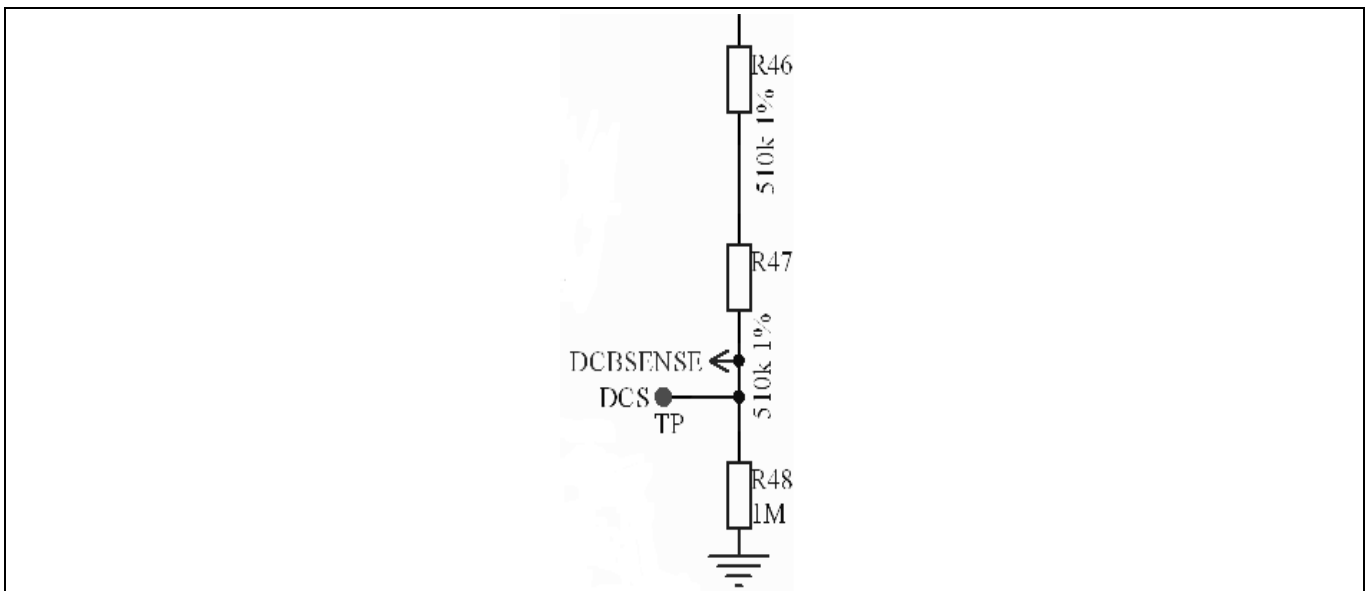


Figure 17 DC bus sensing

R48 is the safety resistance on the connection port when the connector is open. The DC bus sensing low side resistance is $R_{48} // R_1$ (R_1 is the pull-down resistor on EVAL-M1-101T). It is:

$$\sum R_{\text{low side}} = \frac{1 \text{ M}\Omega \times 13.3 \text{ k}\Omega}{1 \text{ M}\Omega + 13.3 \text{ k}\Omega} = 13.13 \text{ k}\Omega$$

3.4 Current sensing and amplifying

The current feedback of EVAL-M1-05F310R is single-shunt sensing by R16. It is 5 mΩ. The current output IU+ and IU- goes to J3.

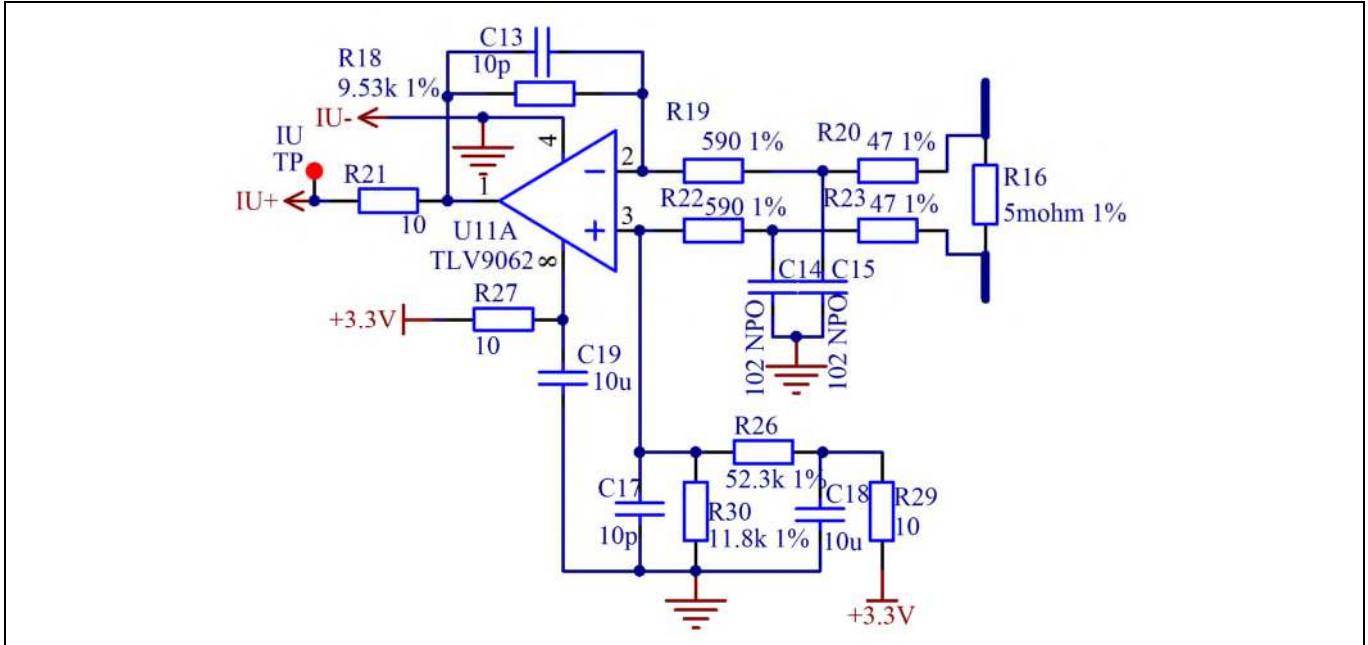


Figure 18 Current sense and signal amplification

An LPF consists of R20/R23/C14/C15 to remove EMC noise from R16. The current amplifier consists of R18/R19/R20/R22/R23/C13 U1A for lower noise and proportional amplifier.

The gain of the amplifier is:

$$G = \frac{R18 + R19 + R20}{R19 + R20} = 15.96$$

The current scaling is:

$$V_{shunt} = R16 \times G = 79.8 \text{ mV/A}$$

Static status:

$$V_o = \frac{R30 \times 3.3 \text{ V}}{R26 + R29 + R30} = 0.607 \text{ V}$$

The response time:

$$T_0 = \frac{1}{\frac{GBWP_{U11a}}{A - 1}} = 1.5 \mu\text{s}$$

R21 matches the resistance with U11A output. The GBWP is gain bandwidth of U11.

3.5 Current feedback to the control board

The circuit below shows the feedback current signal to the control board. The offset circuit consists of R6 and 3.3V.

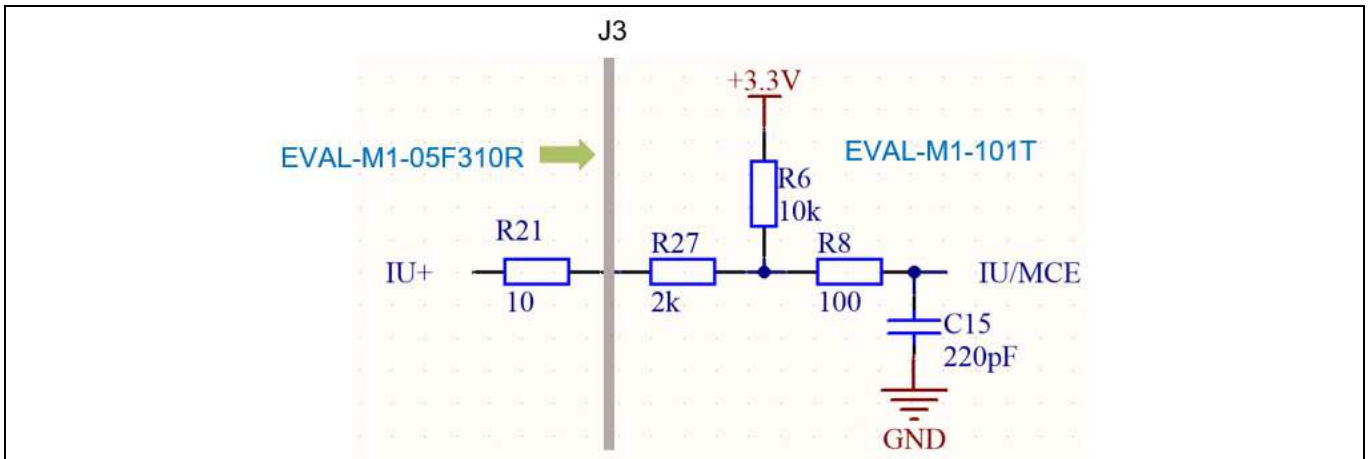


Figure 19 Current signal transmission of EVAL-M1-05F310R+EVAL-M1-101T

The attenuation of the current signal from IU+ to IU:

$$\alpha = \frac{R6}{R6 + R21 + R27} = 0.833$$

Total gain to IU input:

$$\sum G = \alpha \times G = 13.29$$

Total current scaling to IU input:

$$V_{shunt2} = R16 \times \sum G = 66.4 \text{ mV/A}$$

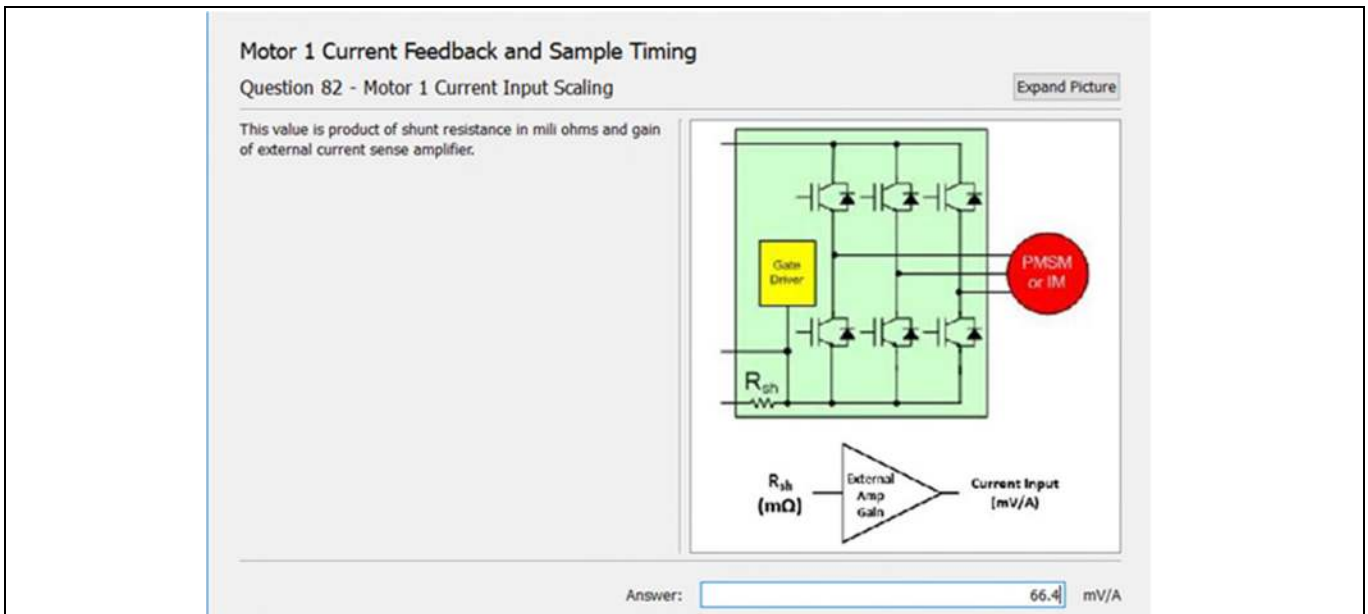


Figure 20 Current input scaling setup in MCEWizard

The current offset to IU input:

$$V_{offset} = (3.3 \text{ V} - 0.6 \text{ V}) \times \frac{R21 + R27}{R6 + R21 + R27} + 0.6 \text{ V} = 1.06 \text{ V}$$

Since the control board of the ADC range is 3.3 V, we have to select the internal gain of control board to “1”.

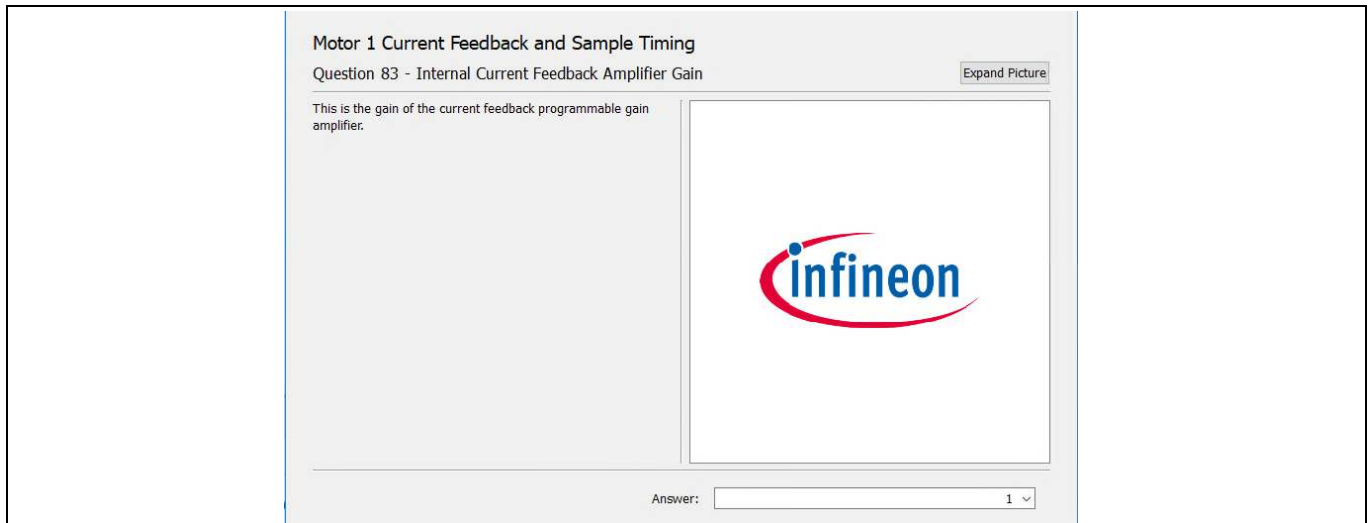


Figure 21 Setup current signal gain to “1”

3.6 OCP, GK and IOCP setup

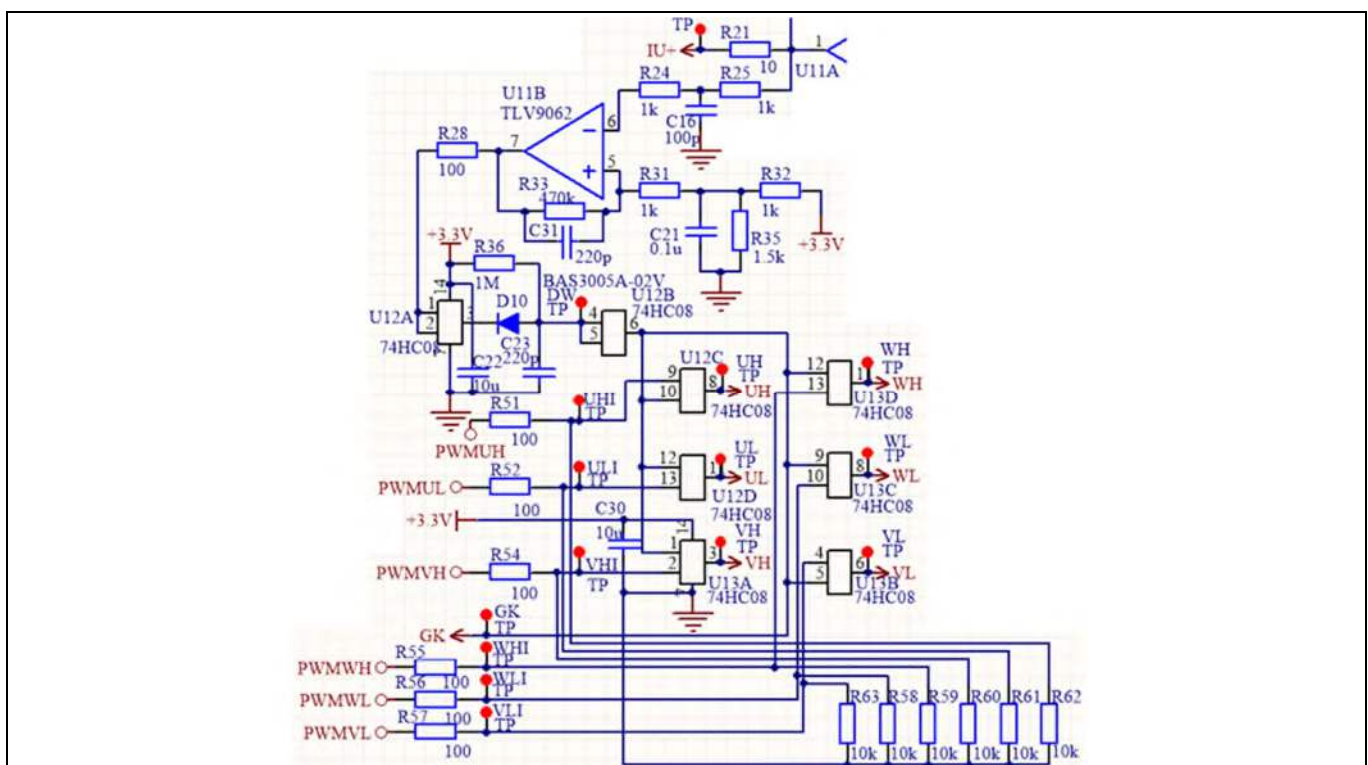


Figure 22 Overcurrent and GK/PWM shutdown

Figure 22 is the overcurrent protection (OC) and gate kill (GK) circuit. The PWMUH, PWMUL, PWMVH, PWMVL, PWMWH, PWMWL are three-phase 3.3 V level PWM from J3 (from EVAL-M1-101T). UH, UL, VH, VL, WH, WL is 3.3 V level PWM to U1, U2, U3 (IPM). The following: R51, R52, R54, R55, R56, R57 are input resistors for damping noise from connections. R58, R59, R60, R61, R62, R63 are pull-down resistors for preventing noise from input open (J3).

3.6.1 OCP setup on EVAL-M1-05F310R

The threshold voltage of the schmid trigger (U11B) is set to:

$$V_{\text{TriphTH}} = \frac{R35}{R32 + R35} \times 3.3 \text{ V} = 1.98 \text{ V}$$

The reflected overcurrent threshold:

$$I_{\text{TriphTH}} = \frac{V_{\text{TriphTH}} - V_o}{V_{\text{shunt1}}} = 17.2 \text{ A}$$

The response time:

$$T_D = R25 \times C16 = 100 \text{ ns}$$

When shunt current is over 17.2 A, U11B pin 7 outputs “0”.

3.6.2 PWM shutdown and GK output

U12A is a buffer circuit for the comparator. When overcurrent occurs, U11B pin 7 outputs “0”, C23 will be fast. A logic “0” signal appears on the output of U12B. This is a shutdown signal for all PWM inputs. This is also a gate-kill signal to J3 to inform the control board to stop PWM output. The total delay time of the shutdown is:

$$\sum T_D = T_O + T_D = 1.5 \mu\text{s} + 0.1 \mu\text{s} = 1.6 \mu\text{s}$$

When the over current is removed. U11B will go logic “1”. C23 will be charged by R36. The charge time constant is:

$$T_{\text{up}} = R36 \times C23 = 220 \mu\text{s}$$

For each overcurrent, U12B will output about 220 μs “0” for shutdown PWM and branch control system through J3.

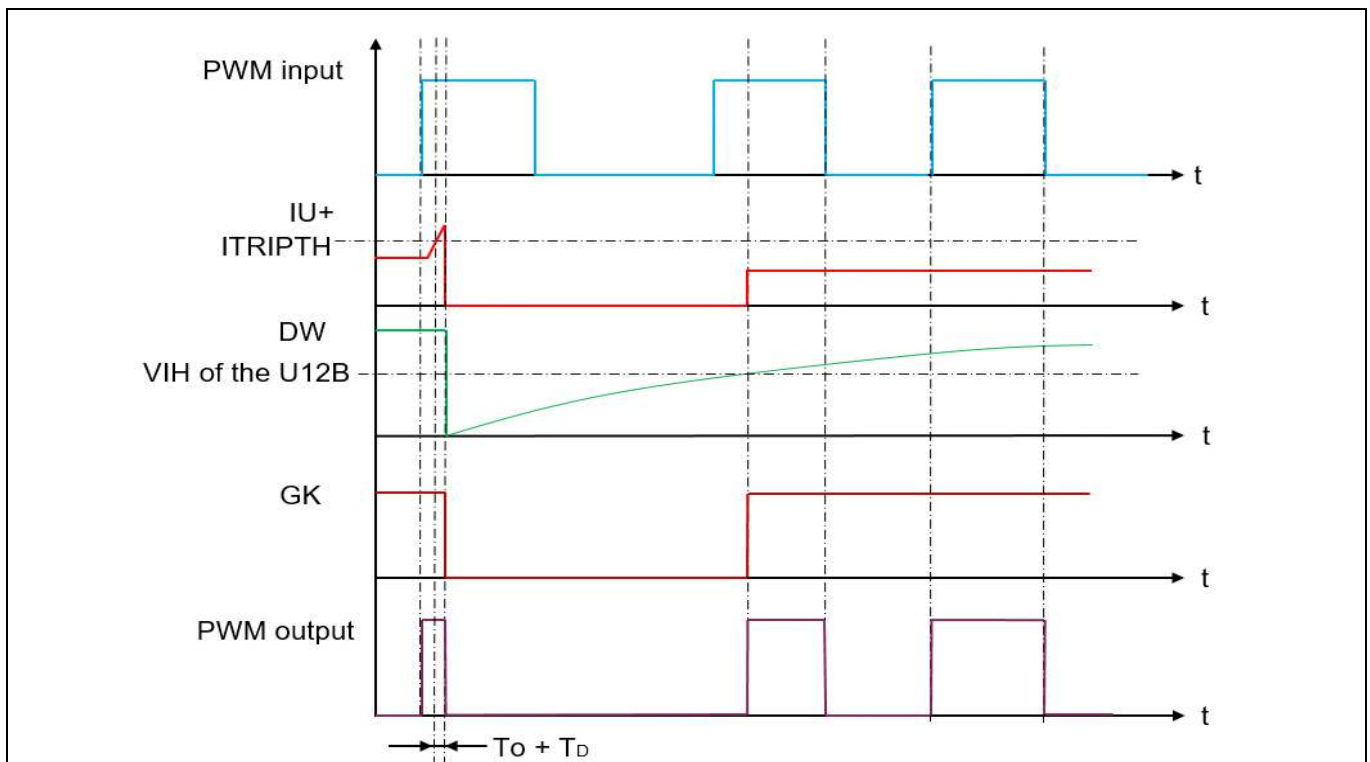


Figure 23 Logic of PWM input/output and DW/GK

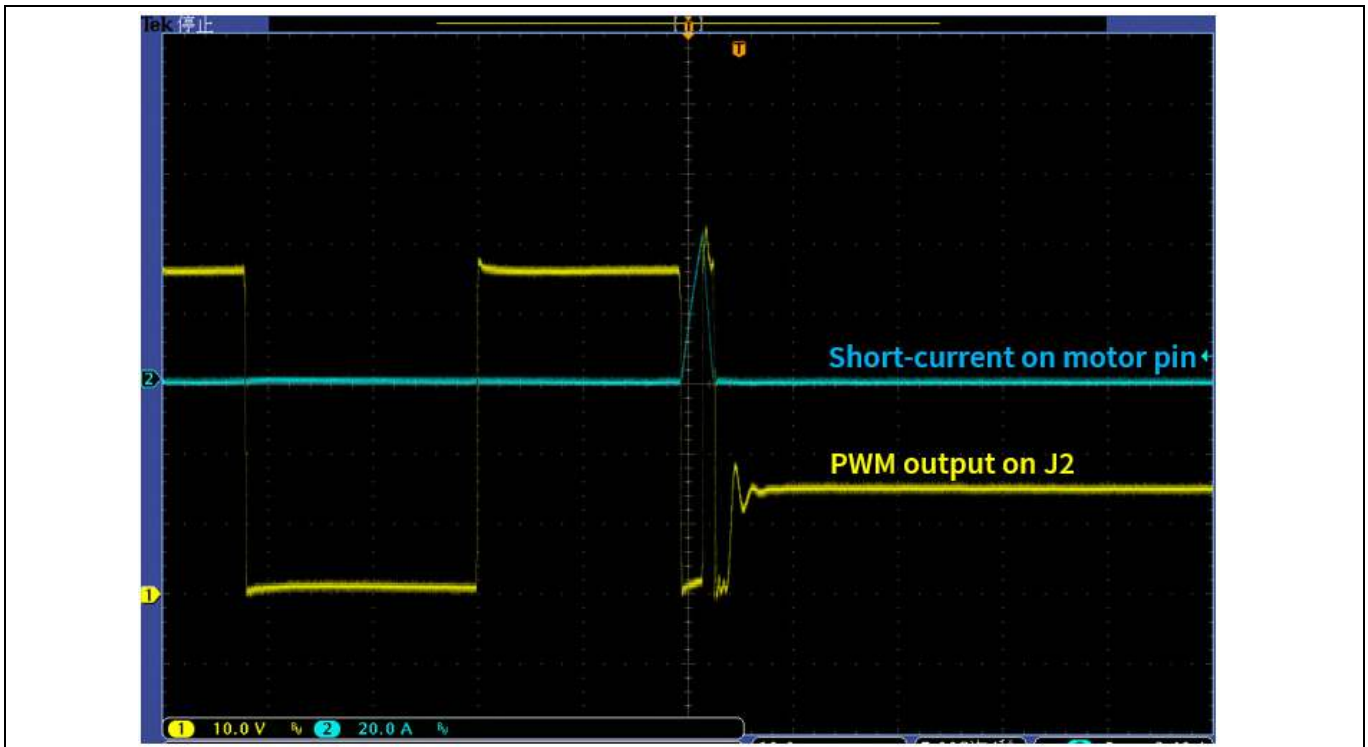


Figure 24 Waveform of overcurrent and PWM shutdown

3.6.3 OCP setup in MCEWizard

EVAL-M1-101T has an internal comparator. The default value of the threshold is 1.8 V (corresponding 17 A).

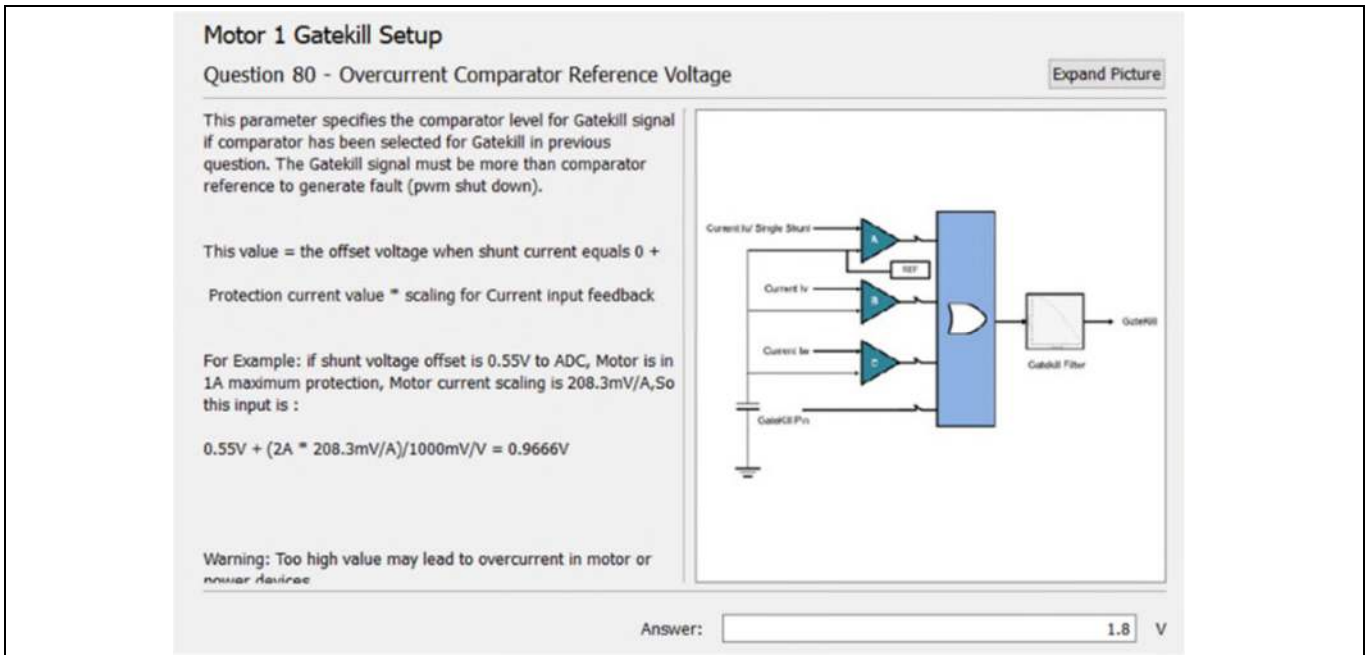


Figure 25 Overcurrent setup in MCEWizard

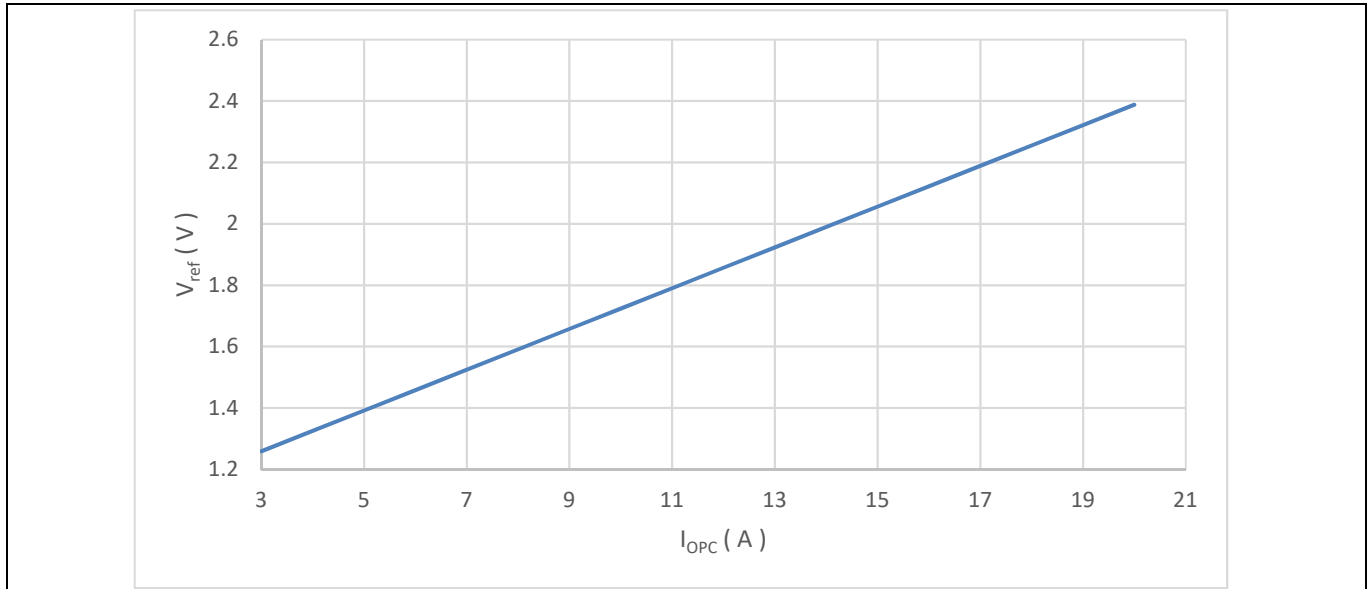


Figure 26 V_{ref} vs overcurrent (I_{opc})

3.7 NTC thermistor characteristics and over-heating protection calculation

EVAL-M1-05F310R has an NTC (R46) to measure T_c for over-temperature protection on top of U2. This temperature value is sent to EVAL-M1-101T. The part number is NTC is NXRT 15WF 104FA1B.

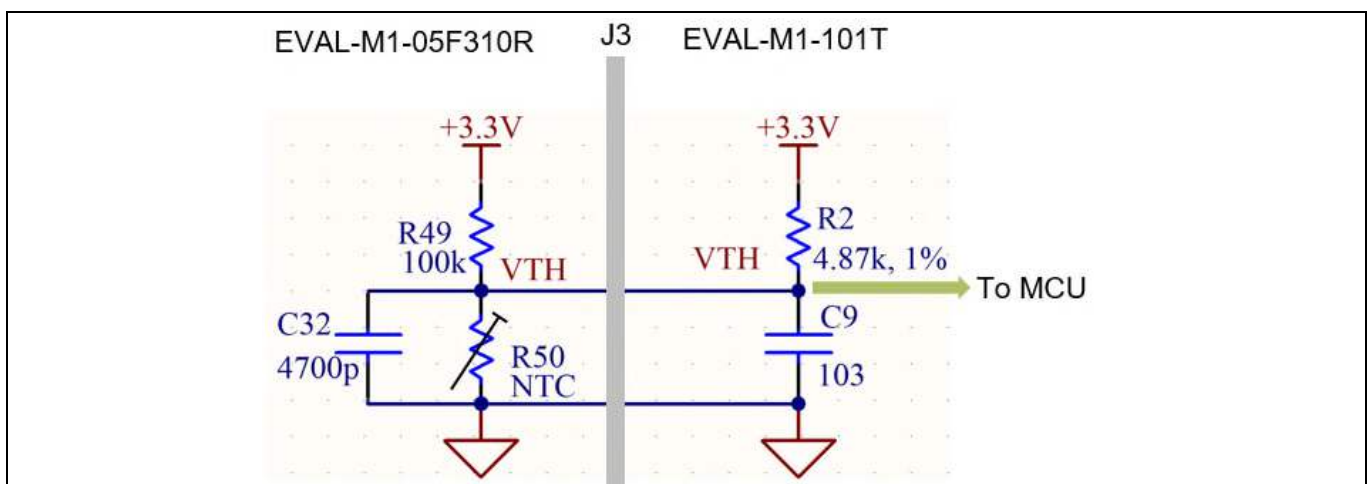


Figure 27 NTC(R50) on EVAL-M1-05F310R and connection to EVAL-M1-101T via J3

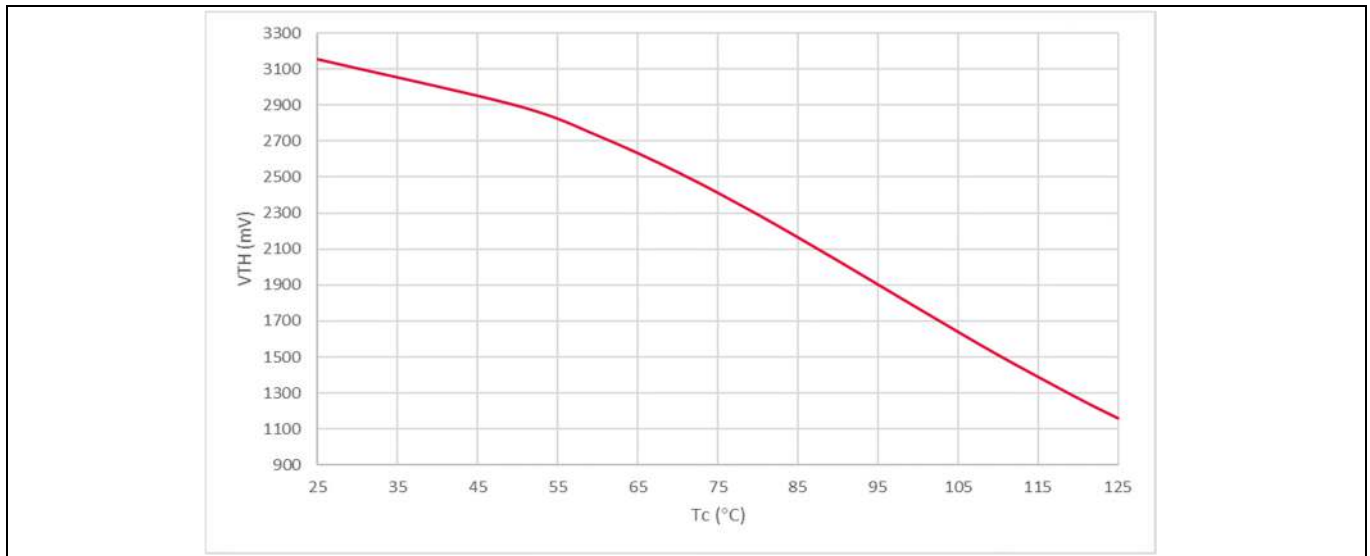


Figure 28 VTH output to EVAL-M1-101T

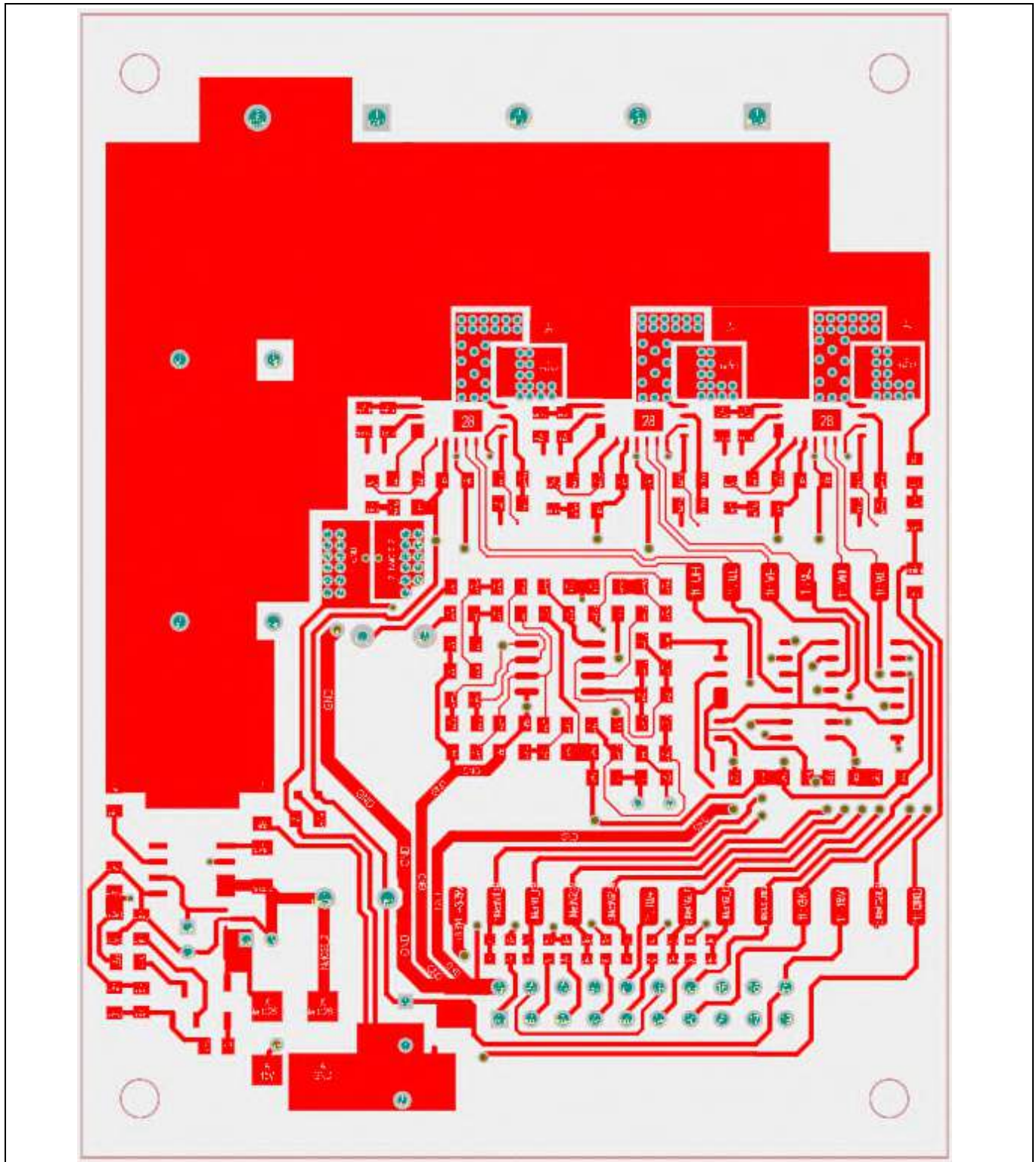


Figure 30 Top layer

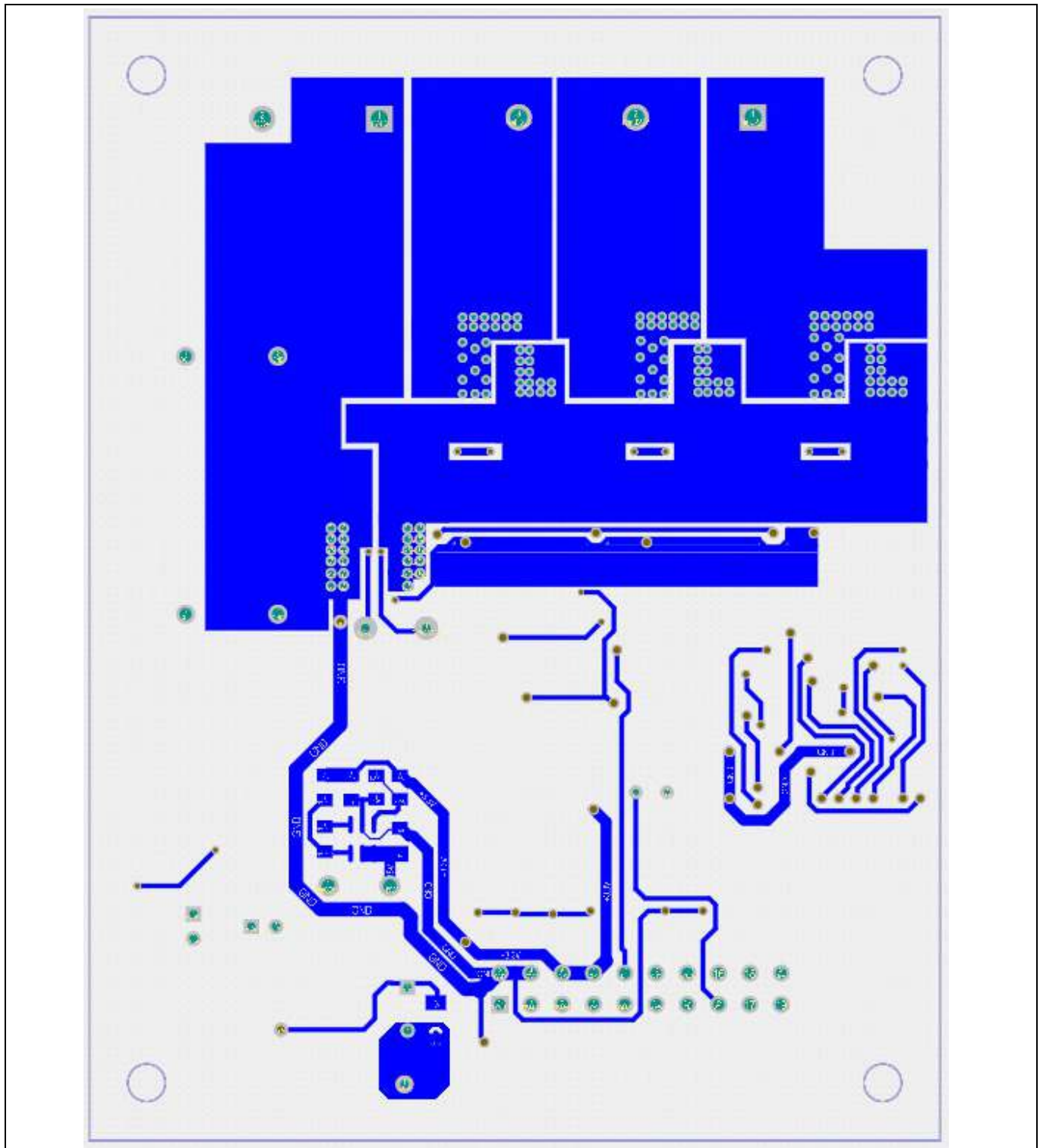


Figure 31 Bottom layer

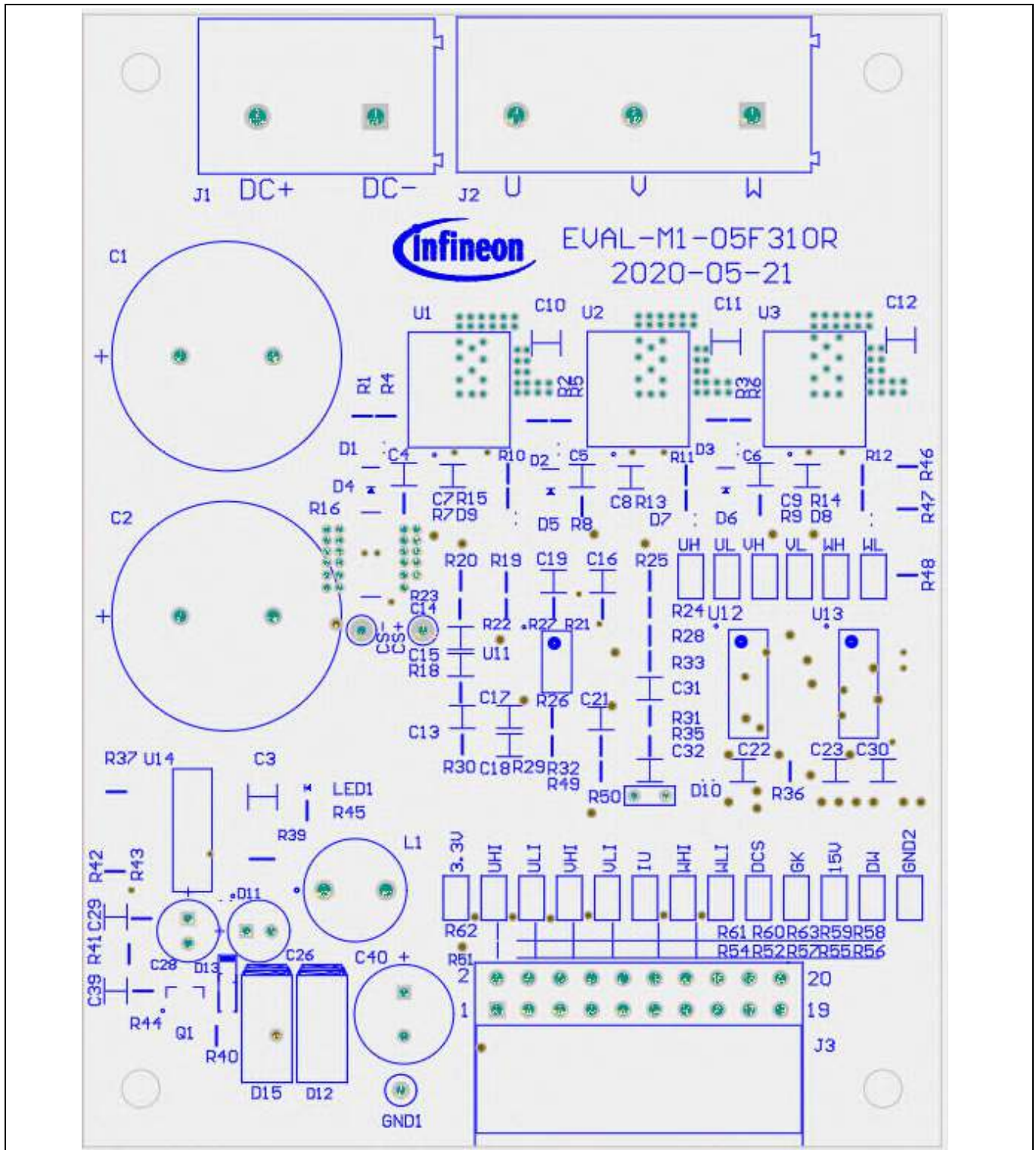


Figure 32 Top over layer

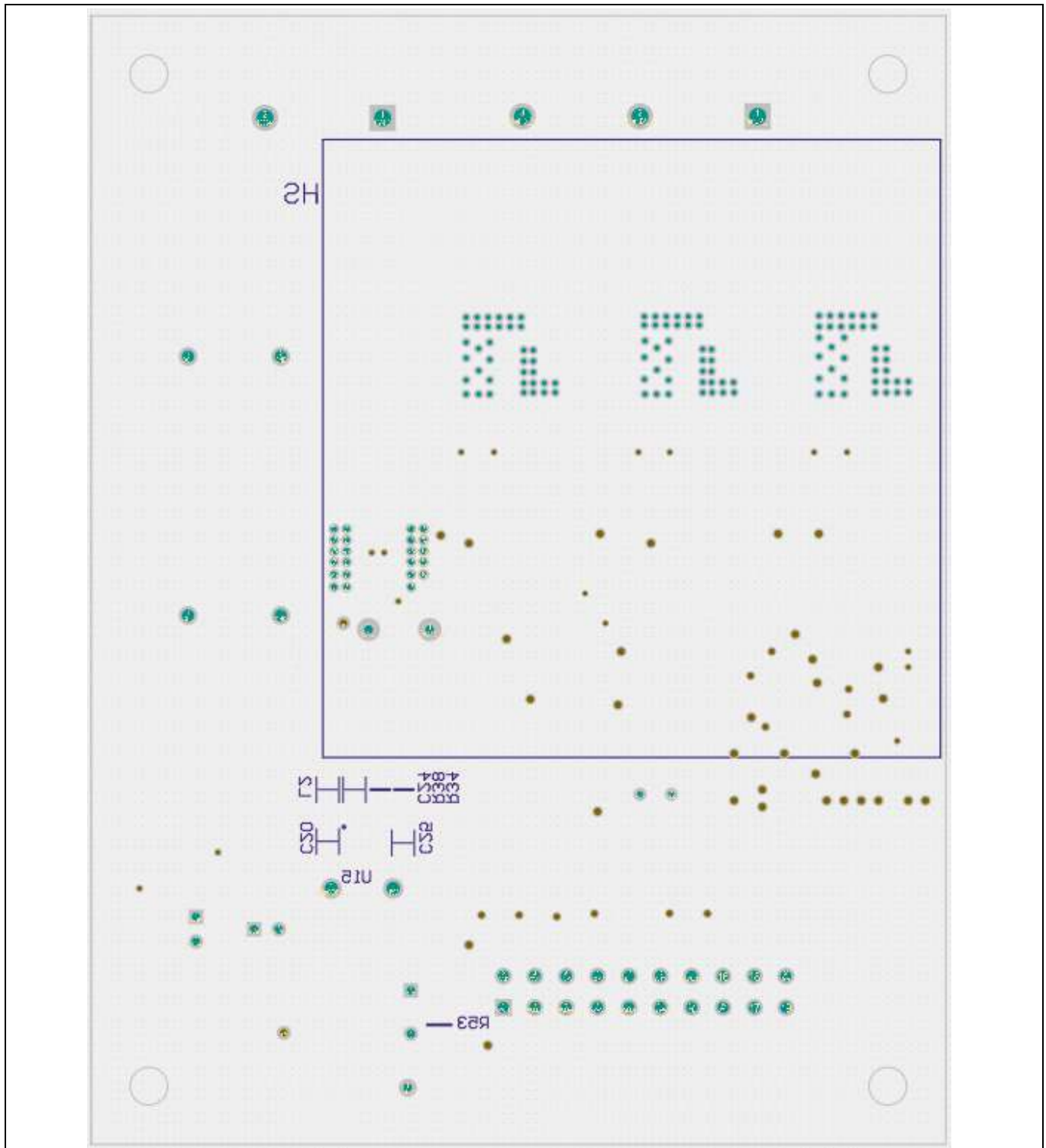


Figure 33 Bottom over layer

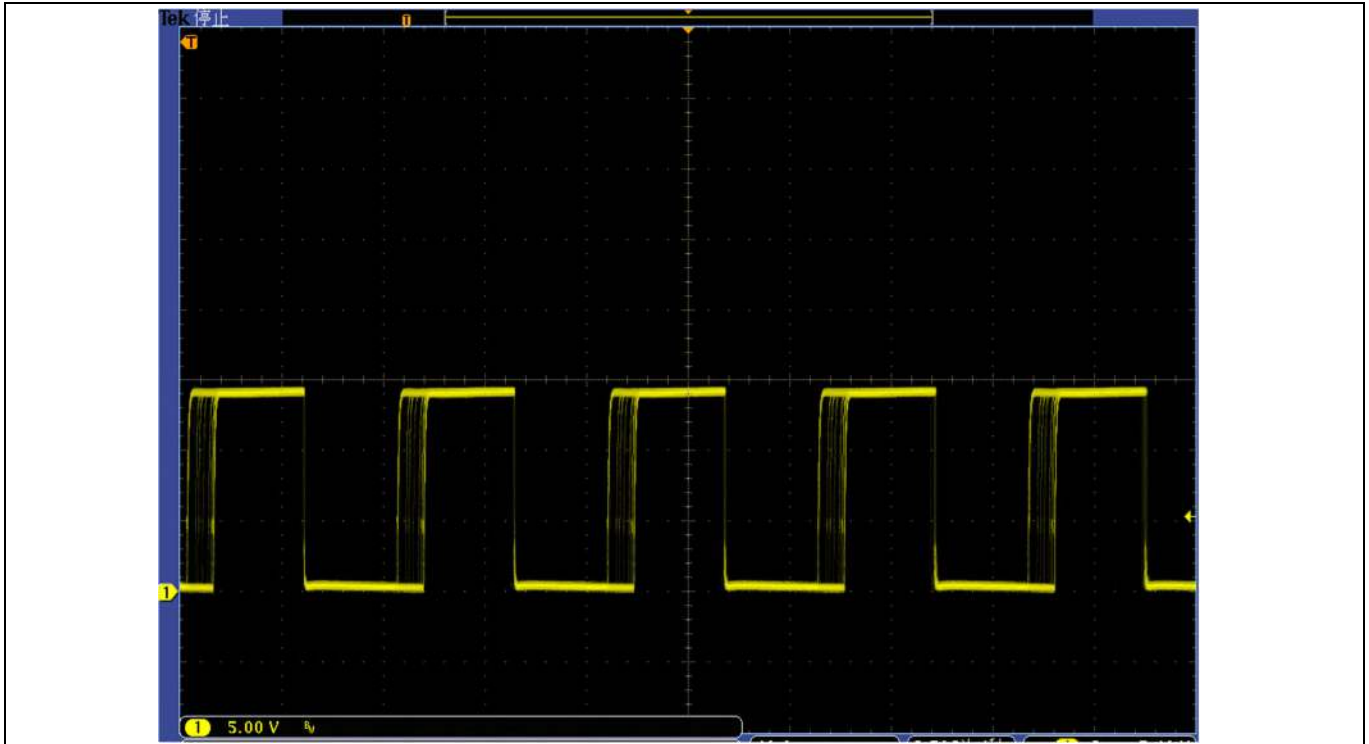


Figure 34 IRSM005-301MH gate drive

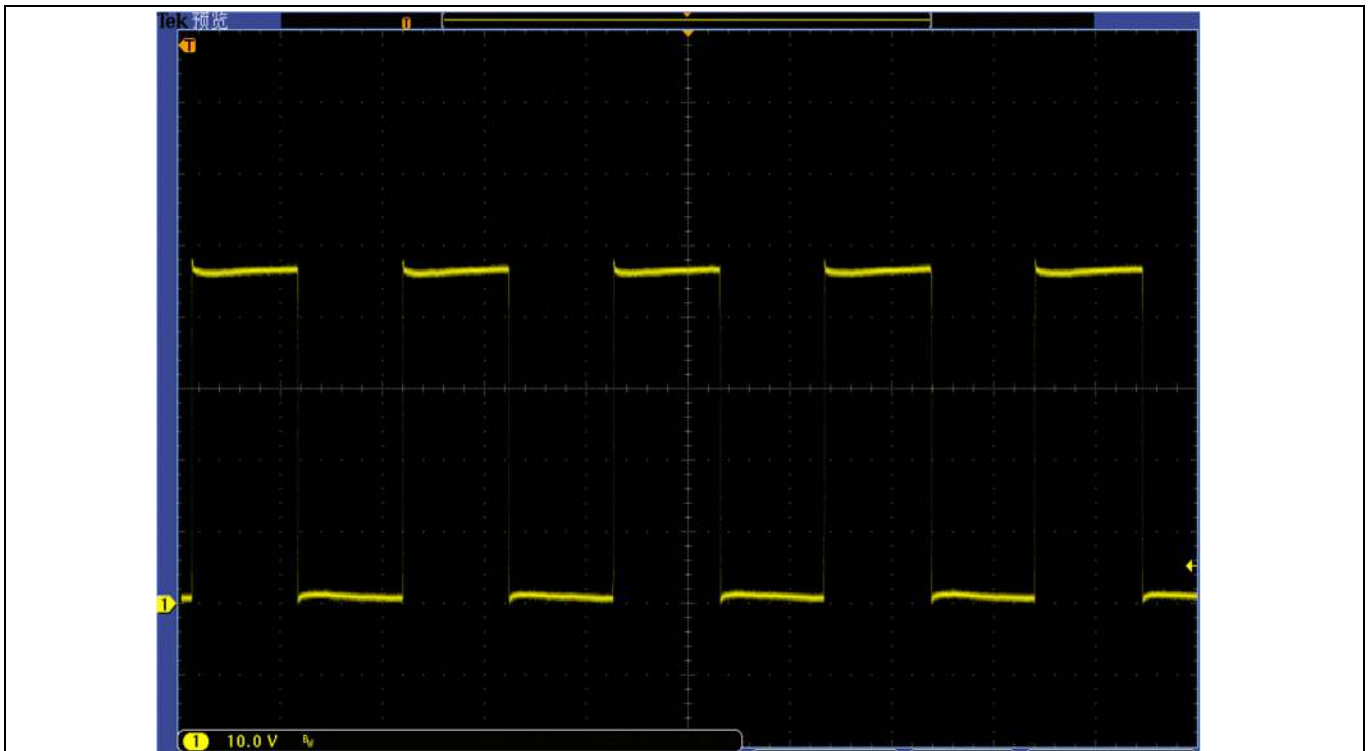


Figure 35 IRSM005-301MH PWM power output

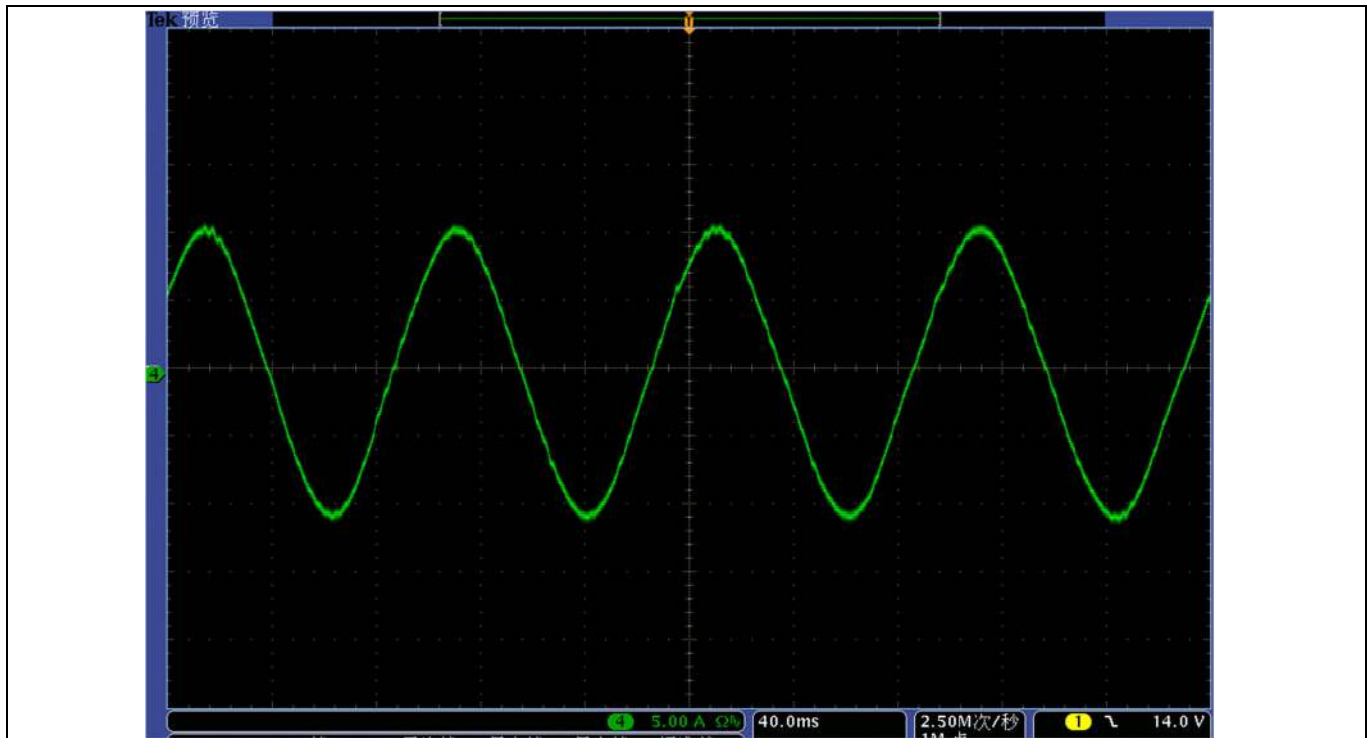


Figure 36 I_o output current @ DC 48 V, FPWM = 12 kHz

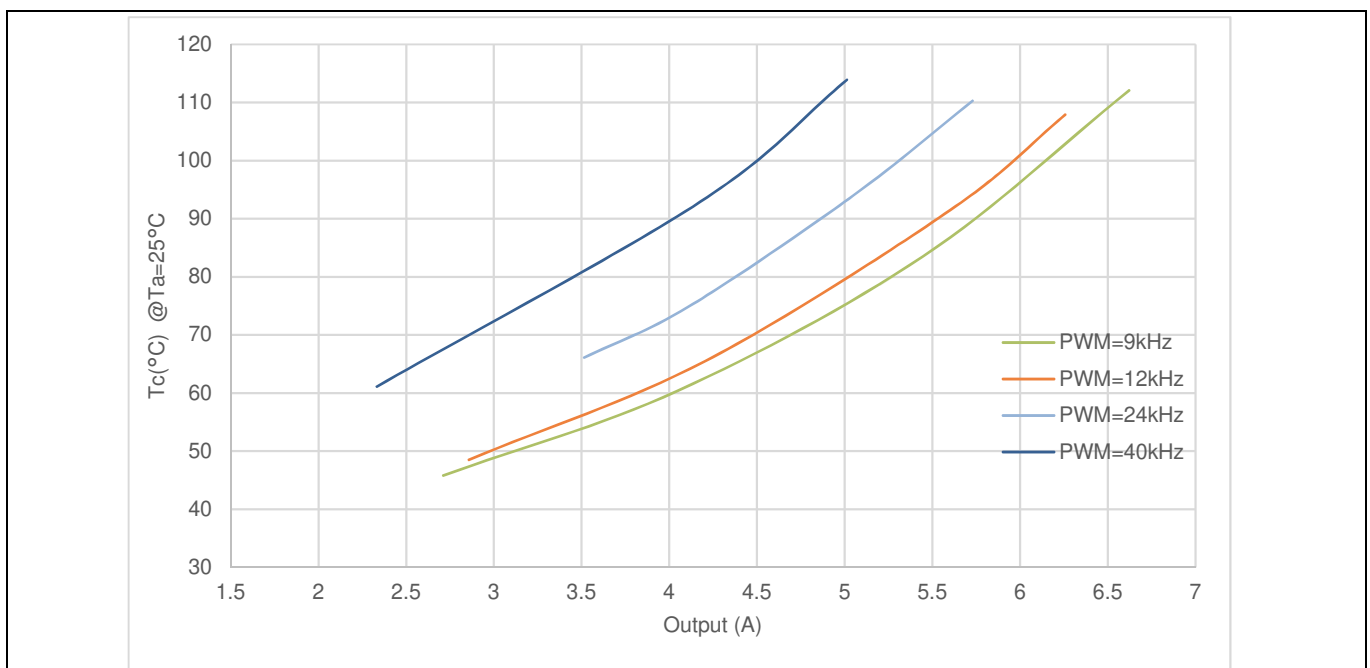


Figure 37 IRSM005F301MH case temperature vs output current with different PWM frequency (at 48 VDC, $T_a=25^\circ\text{C}$)

4.3 Options for cooling

EVAL-M1-05F310R has three cooling options for easy configuration and extending to higher power applications.

1. Self-cooling (default)
2. Heat-sink cooling
3. Fan cooling

4.3.1 Self-cooling

IRSM005-301MH is the double-sided cooling on the PCB done by copper and vias. For 0~6.2 A loading (input: DC 48 V, $f_{PWM}=9$ kHz, $T_a=25^\circ\text{C}$, $T_c \leq 100^\circ\text{C}$), the EVAL-M1-05F310R can operate well with PCB copper heat dissipation, and does not need an additional heat sink.

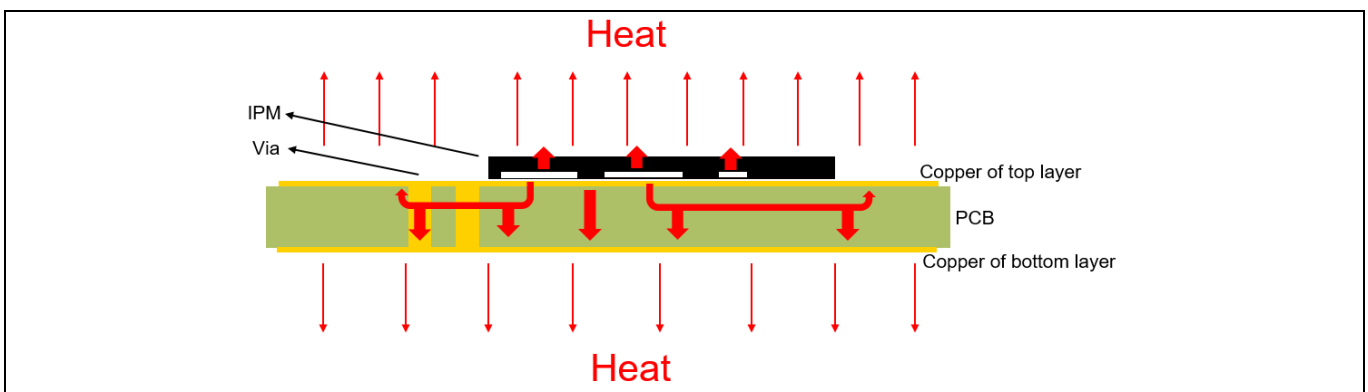


Figure 38 IRSM005-301MH heat conduction and cooling by two layers PCB copper

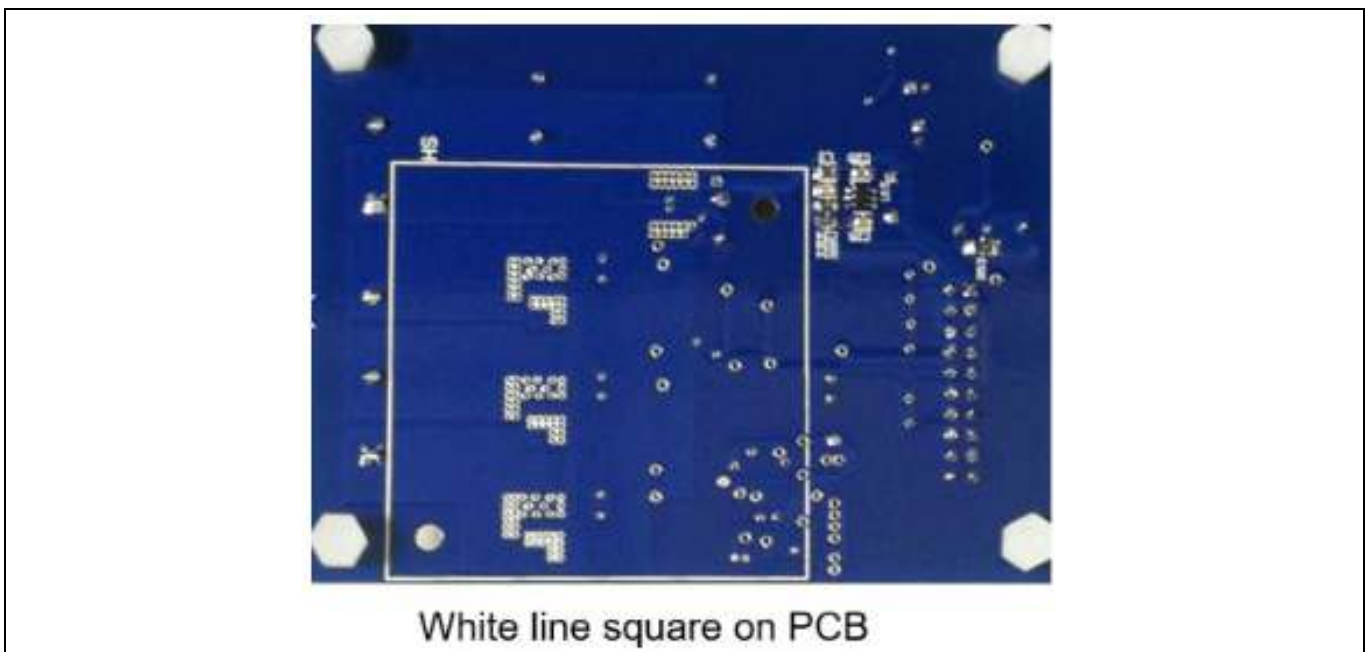


Figure 39 White lined square of installed heat sink

This evaluation board reserves space for mounting an additional heat sink to extend output power. Figure 16 shows how to mount the heat sink. Please note the isolation thermal pad is required to isolate the PCB circuit to heat sink.

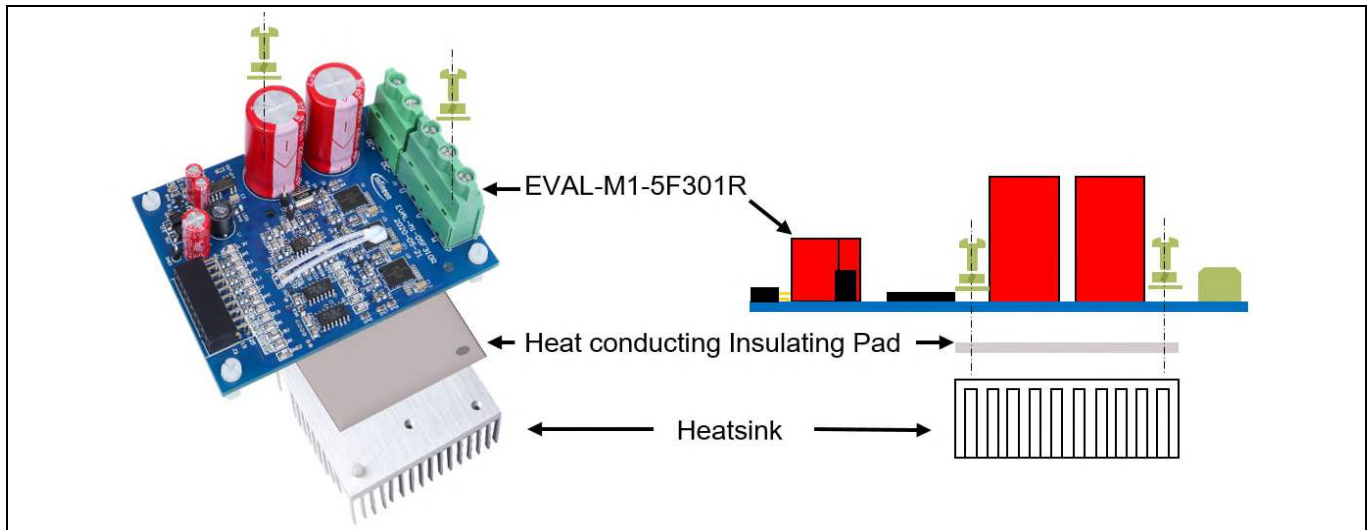


Figure 40 Instruction for heat sink installation

4. Screw: M3 \times 10

4.3.3 Fan cooling

Whether in self-cooling or heat sink mode, EVAL-M1-05F310R supports additional fan cooling.

In the fan cooling mode, please set up Tc limited lower than 85°C so as not to overheat the MOSFET.
