Description

The STPS30SM60D is a single diode Schottky rectifier, suited for high frequency switch mode power supply.

Packaged in TO-220AC, this device is intended to be used in notebook, game station and desktop adapters, providing in these aplications a good efficiency at both low and high load.





Figure 1. Electrical characteristics^(a)

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Figure 2. Average forward power dissipation Figure 3. Average forward current versus versus average forward current ambient temperature ($\delta = 0.5$)




Figure 4. Normalized avalanche power derating versus pulse duration

Figure 5. Normalized avalanche power derating versus junction temperature





Figure 6. Non repetitive surge peak forward current versus overload duration (maximum values)


Figure 7. Relative thermal impedance junction to case versus pulse duration

Figure 9. Junction capacitance versus reverse voltage applied (typical values)








Figure 10. Forward voltage drop versus forward current

Figure 11. Reverse safe operating area $(t_p < 1 \mu s \text{ and } T_i < 150 \,^{\circ}\text{C})$




