


## Fig.1 Power Dissipation Derating Curve

Fig.2 Maximum Safe Operating Area





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Fig.3 Normalized Transient Thermal Resistance vs. Pulse Width

Fig.6 Typical Output Characteristics(II)






Fig.7 Breakdown Voltage vs. Fig.8 Typical Transfer Characteristics Junction Temperature








## Fig.9 Gate Threshold Voltage vs. Junction Temperature

Fig.12 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Gate Source Voltage










Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Junction Temperature Fig.14 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (I)





Fig.16 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (III)




Fig.17 Typical Capacitances vs.

## Fig.18 Switching Characteristics




Fig.19 Typical Gate Charge






Fig.20 Source Current vs. Source Drain Voltage




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


Fig.1-1 Switching Time Measurement Circuit




## Fig.2-1 Gate Charge Measurement Circuit




## Fig.3-1 Avalanche Measurement Circuit




## Fig.1-2 Switching Waveforms



## Fig.2-2 Gate Charge Waveform





## Fig.3-2 Avalanche Waveform





