




Figure 2: Typical Reverse Characteristics




Figure 3: Power Derating Curves






Figure 4: Current Derating Curves (Typical V<sub>F</sub>)



 $I_F = f(T_C); D = t_P/T; T_j \le 175^{\circ}C; f_{SW} > 10kHz$ 










Figure 6: Typical Junction Capacitance vs Reverse Voltage Characteristics




 $C = f(V_R)$ ; f = 1MHz

 $Q_C = f(V_R)$ ; f = 1MHz


Figure 8: Typical Capacitive Energy vs Reverse Voltage Characteristics



 $E_C = f(V_R)$ ; f = 1MHz




Figure 9: Transient Thermal Impedance


